One of the most important resources is the electronic version of the [STYLE GUIDE](#). There are also extra copies of this packet available for your use in the LMC.




To find **BOOKS** that are both physically in the library and available electronically, use the [DESTINY CATALOG](#).

When you search for books, any search item that has a **SOLID** blue book beside it is available in the library on the shelf.

**DATABASES** will help you find magazine and journal articles about your topic. These databases may also have links to additional websites that you will find useful.

ALL of our databases are now located in [MACKINVIA](#). When you first sign in, you may be asked your location. Start typing [York Suburban High School](#). The school name will come up and you choose it from the list. Then LOG IN with your school Google account.

One database useful to this project is [SIRS ISSUES RESEARCHER](#). When you search for your topic on this site, you will find newspaper or magazine articles that address your topic. Many of these articles were previously published in news sources.

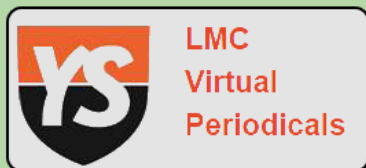
The other database useful to this project is [ISSUES: UNDERSTANDING CONTROVERSY AND SOCIETY](#). When you search for your topic on this site, you will find more of an overview of your topic as you would in a book source. This source is good for background information and global views of topics.

[GALE ONE FILE HIGH SCHOOL EDITION](#) is a collection of articles from magazines, journals, newspapers and reference books. This can **ONLY** be accessed while you are on the school campus. However, once you find an article, you can download it to your GoogleDrive.



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The [YS VIRTUAL FILE](#) is a collection of materials from outside sources that previous students have found and used in their research projects. Once you sign in, simply search your topic. Clicking on a link will open a PDF file of a source - usually a magazine or journal article. *Citing these sources can be a little tricky.
