Robotics at the Elementary Schools: After conversations with Thomas Cahill and Jack Healey, two senior members of our now famous Robodogs, each of the three elementary schools will have one or two Junior FIRST Lego League teams up and running by mid-October. Through the efforts of Ms. Katie Healey, engineering teacher at CHS and coach of the FIRST Robotics program, along with members of the Robodogs, several parents at the elementary level have been recruited to take on teams. Each school will have one or two teachers managing the teams with parents as coaches. Robodog team member Matt Gaughan recently established training workshops for the parents and teachers, and they are hoping to have the teams off and running in mid October. All of this came as a result of our Robodog team members being concerned that "feeder" groups were lacking at the elementary level, and the program would not be able to expand. Dr. Fischer-Mueller thanked Mrs. Healey, Thomas Cahill, Jack Healey, Matt Gaughan, and the parent volunteers who are taking on the development of new Junior FIRST Lego Leagues. The teachers will be as follows: Justin Martin-Hansen; Jill Marsh and Adrienne Shemtove – Luce; and Marci DiCara – JFK.

E. New Business

- Superintendent's FY17 Evaluation and FY18 Goals: Chairman, Michael Loughran presented the Superintendent's FY17 Evaluation and FY18 Goals. The goals included:
 - i. Goal 1: Implementing Strategic Area of Focus 1.1 Educational Equity as defined in the Strategic Framework.
 - ii. Goal 2: Continue to advance the professional culture of the school system, including implementation of Strategic Area of Focus 2.3 Professional Culture as defined in the Strategic Framework.

- iii. Goal 3: Implement Strategic Area of Focus 3.3 Educators' Creativity and Innovation as defined in the Strategic Framework.
- iv. Goal 4: Implement Long-term Strategic Objective 4 Achieving District Excellence as defined in the Strategic Framework.

The Superintendent was rated as proficient in goals 1, 2 and 4. Dr. Fischer-Mueller was rated as exemplary for goal 3.

 School Improvement Plans: School Improvement Plans for Early Childhood, Galvin Middle School and Canton High School were presented. All School Improvement plans will be available online, once approved by School Committee.

Donna Kilday presented the School Improvement Plan for the Rodman Early Childhood Center. The 2017-18 goals include:

- #1 through a series of professional development opportunities, all Rodman educators will increase their capacity to better meet the social, emotional and behavioral needs of students in the inclusive setting.
- #2 Rodman educators will foster critical thinking and problem solving skills in all students by designing science units which support the school values of academic rigor, inclusive opportunities and accessibility for all students.
- #3 Rodman staff will engage in data analysis of every student in order to adapt instruction and interventions to allow for increased growth and learning.

Dr. William Conard presented the Galvin Middle School Improvement Plan. The GMS School Improvement Plan for 2017-18 includes:

- #1 School Culture and Student Experience Creating a school culture that
 places students at its center, with an emphasis on the development of
 positive, healthy relationships that promote students' well-being and
 growth.
- #2 Transformational Teaching and Learning Strengthen and broaden the repertoire of instructional strategies used by GMS educators through consistent, focused professional collaboration that promotes collective accountability for the success of students.
- #3 The Pilot Team Increasing student engagement growth and achievement by supporting the development of Team Silver as they pilot an approach that maximizes interdisciplinary and relevant learning opportunities that support the academic, social, and emotional needs of their students.

Derek Folan presented the Canton High School Improvement Plan. The CHS goals included:

• #1 Cultivating School Climate and Culture - Cultivation of a school culture that features a safe, welcoming, inclusive learning environment

- that ensures rigorous and equitable opportunities for high achievement for all students.
- #2 Transforming Teaching and Learning Design transformative authentic student learning experiences through teacher collaboration and the cultivation of a strong professional culture.
- #3 Achieving Educational Excellence and Ensuring Equity Increase achievement on Advanced Placement (AP) exams so that 80% of AP students earn a score of three or better, while also ensuring AP participation reflects the demographic breakdown of Canton High School.
- #4 Achieving District Excellence Expand technology use through bring-your-own-device (BYOD) program to promote authentic, student-centered learning and to showcase transformative, high-level learning experiences at Canton High School.
- 3. Summer 2017 Technology Update: Technology Integration Administrator, April Goran, presented the Technology updates provided over the Summer. The update included the new substitute and absence software, Frontline and its implementation plan. The summer updates included the CHS and GMS portals, training teams, community web pages, Rediker updates, and many more updates to technology. Technology Staff Professional Development was also offered.
- 4. <u>Van Donation</u>: Ed Amico presented the information for a proposed van donation made by Rodman Ford. The fifteen passenger van will be used for extracurricular activities, sports, field trips, college visits and many other school activity. Barry Nectow then requested a vote to accept the proposed van donation. Kristin Mirliani motioned to approve acceptance of a donated van from Rodman Ford. Meg Gannon seconded the motion. It was voted 5-0. The School Committee thanked Rodman Ford for their continued generosity.
- 5. <u>Green Community</u> Dr. Jennifer Fischer-Mueller presented the Vehicle Energy Efficiency policy as part of the Town of Canton's Green Communities Application. Dr. Fischer-Mueller then requested a vote of approval from the School Committee to adopt this policy. Kristin Mirliani motioned to adopt the policy. Meg Gannon seconded the motion. It was voted 5-0.
- 6. <u>CPC Proposal</u> Barry Nectow presented a proposal to seek support from the Community Preservation Committee for an elementary school playground and request a vote of approval. Reuki Schutt motioned to approve the request to seek support from the Community Preservation Committee for elementary school playgrounds. Meg Gannon seconded the motion. It was voted 5-0.
