Q2 Writing

What item from your editing checklist should you work to master by the end of the quarter?

What else do you need to work on in terms of editing?

What writing mini-lesson technique or concept did you identify as your greatest need?

What are some topics that you should explore in your writing that you haven't written about yet? What topics should you write about that you have avoided so far? These might be topics that are personal or difficult to write about, things that matter deeply to you, or just things that you haven't written about yet that are worth exploring in your writing for a variety of reasons.

Q2 Reading

What do you need to work on the most this quarter as a reader?

Each of you will have a goal related to your productivity as a reader. This might be a goal for the number of books you'll finish during 2nd quarter or it might be a goal related to your daily/weekly progress. Think about which of these you'd like to use and come up with an idea for what your goal might be.
