- Homophones (words that sound alike):

- Multiple meanings:
  - o "Time flies like an arrow. Fruit flies like a banana." (flies/flies)
  - o "A boiled egg in the morning is hard to beat." (hard to beat/hard to beat)
- Portmanteaus (blending two words):
  - o "I used to be addicted to soap, but I'm clean now." (clean/clean)

- Rhyming puns:
  - o "The poor baker he didn't have enough dough." (dough/dough)
