Principal's Report

1. PBIS Report-Melissa Colbeck is the parent representative along with Sam Reyes and Sarah Gardner representing the Noddin staff. The goal of PBIS (positive behavioral intervention support) is behavior prevention program. 1400 schools have already adopted this program. Within our district 4 schools rolled out last year and 4 others will be rolling the program out this school year. The goal is to create consistent expectations around campus. This is a 5 year initiative with the 1st year focus on school wide expectations. The representatives from Noddin will be training the Teachers, who will be implementing PBIS and HSC will have some involvement with rollout next school year. The hope is parents will help support by reinforcing these expectations at home.



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Treasurer's Report

- BTS drive and field trip donations are still being collected. To date we have raised 50% of the field trip goal, and 60% of the enrichment drive goal. Corporate donations are trickling in slowly. We need help educating our community about HSC and what programs are directly funded by the enrichment drive.
- Fundraising ideas are all being considered- ice cream Wed, raffles- need to register for the raffle and must disclose 90 days in advance. Raffle baskets- as part of an auction. Other ideas: hiking and pancake breakfast.
- Support from our parents makes all these things possible and will be necessary to take on any new fundraising ideas! The Board plans to discuss additional ideas for fundraising. Planning for a thank you video around the holidays to celebrate and thank all of our volunteers and teachers.

President's Report

Committee Reports/Nenow Business

1. Noddin Fest - Thanks to all the volunteers who made it a success! Many thanks to Sri and Orin for running this event! Food trucks were a hit and these businesses plan to give back 10% of proceeds made at Noddin Fest. Noddin Fest generated \$17k in sales and expenses were below budget at roughly \$9k. Great job by the team who managed this event! While the goal of the event is community building, it's great we were able to generate profit!
2. Movie Night- Roughly 500 people attended this event. Great time had by all! Big thank you to Tricia for planning this fun event!
3. Book fair- Pairing the start of Book Fair with movie night was a big success! Book fair continues to be busy with the last day scheduled for the 13th .
4. Yearbook- Picture day is this Friday, Oct 13th. A Yearbook crew is being created and will consist of 2 students per class in 4th and 5th grades. These students will have a voice in what goes in the yearbook, create surveys and polls, etc.
5. Spirit Store- Set up a booth at movie night and we were able to sell \$175 in existing merchandise and recently created a Preorder sale for a Noddin zip up hoodie that will close on Oct 15th. Preorder is a great way to manage Spirit store merchandise since there is no upfront cost to HSC.



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6. Running Club- Is now happening every Monday. The students have already run 1k laps! The participation on the Primary side is really strong with the majority running. Volunteers still needed 12:05-12:55 to help scan laps on Mondays.

7. Walk N Roll- This kicked off last week and we had lots of special guests attend- Council Member Pam Foley, Superintendent Carrie Andrews, and Ralphie. The next walk n roll date is 10/18. The rest of the walk n roll dates for 2023 are published on the Noddin website. Volunteers needed to help pass out stickers and pencils on walk n roll dates.

8. Art in Action- Art is up and running. An Art Show is being planned during Open House in May. Leads have access to all the material and lesson plans will have slide decks to reference. The students will all get sketchbooks to sketch their ideas before creating the final product. Art lessons will be Oct/Nov, Dec, Jan, Feb, Mar, & Apr.

9. 4th Grade Fundraising- There are several fundraising activities planned for this smaller class with the goal to over fundraise. Each child will need to fundraiser approximately \$450 to pay for science camp. The first bake sale occurred on Movie night and was a success! Upcoming events will be an after school movie on Nov 15th, Kona Ice the first Wednesday of each month (Nov 8th), hot cocoa booth and additional bake sales. The students will have an opportunity to sell Mountain Mike's coupons and butter braids with proceeds going directly toward their science camp.

10. Enrichment Drive-To date the enrichment drive has raised \$35k for the general fund and \$25.6k for field trips. Field trips donations will remain on the Noddin website throughout the school year as some parents prefer to pay in installments. Bus costs have gone up substantially and are becoming cost prohibitive.

1. Kiln Room Vent Fan- A repair is needed on the kiln vent fan that functions to cool the kiln down and remove fumes and particles. This necessary repair will cost \$862.66.
