



Bible Lesson Outline for Preschool Children - Jesus Loves the Little Children

Theme: Jesus welcomes and loves all children, no matter how young or small.

Bible Passage: Mark 10:13-16

Materials:

- Large picture of Jesus
- Colorful scarves or ribbons
- Playdough or clay
- Markers or crayons
- Optional: Finger puppets of Jesus and children

Introduction (3-5 minutes):

- Greet the children warmly and welcome them to your lesson.
- Sing a short, upbeat song about Jesus' love, like "Jesus Loves Me" or "He's Got the Whole World in His Hands."

- Finger Puppets (Optional): If you have finger puppets, use them to act out the story of Jesus and the children. This can help younger children visualize the story and make it more interactive.

Wrap-up (2-3 minutes):

- Recap the main lesson: Jesus loves all children, and we should show love and kindness to one another, just like Jesus.
- Sing a closing song, like "Friends of Jesus" or "One Big Family."
- Remind the children that they can always talk to Jesus and ask for his love and help.

Additional Tips:

- Keep the lesson short and engaging, with plenty of songs, movement, and activities.
- Use simple language and avoid complicated theological concepts.
- Encourage participation from all children.
- Be mindful of the children's attention spans and adjust the activities accordingly.
