

INSTAGRAM STORYBOARD

You are creating an Instagram Story about a day in the life of your job. This Instagram story must be **COMPLETE** (i.e. you include all the relevant information) and **COMPELLING** (i.e. someone would **WANT** to watch it--not **JUST** a reporting of facts).




Here are some things to consider including (you can include other things too): Salary, setting, work environment, flexibility, little-known aspects of your job, things you love, things you don't love quite so much, growth/demand for your job, importance of your career to society.

But...what if you don't have this information? **FIND MORE SOURCES!**

You must include **AT LEAST 3** sources--if you have more, you're welcome to use them, but 3 is all that is required at this stage of the project.

You must have **AT LEAST 6** scenes/slides in your story, but feel free to add more if it will help you achieve a full "Day in the Life" experience. Your slides should be a mix of "annotated images" and videos. You will write your "script" or explanation of your choices in the Speaker Notes section of Google Slides--there should be a mix of quotes and paraphrases in your script, and you should mention each of your 3 sources.

THIS IS YOUR PLAN! You should use the storyboard boxes below to draw out how your story will unfold. Remember, you will be able to write over top of the images/add stickers/etc., similar to Instagram and Snapchat.
