

Of these, 20 were classified as not qualified (a), having undergone JAPIC certification but failed to meet the criteria for issuance. Meanwhile, 50 surrenderers (b) successfully obtained their JAPIC certification, confirming their affiliation with recognized groups. However, 10 individuals (c) remain in the pending phase, still awaiting certification. Additionally, there is a backlog of 20 surrenderers (e) whose certification process is delayed, possibly due to administrative bottlenecks or incomplete documentation. B. DISAGGREGATION OF SURRENDERERS

ACTION

Objective: To classify surrenderers into specific groups, enabling targeted program interventions and accurate reporting of disaggregated data.

The table presents the disaggregated count of surrenderers who have undergone JAPIC authentication procedure in FY 2023 Q3, categorizing them into Former Rebels (FRs), Former Violent Extremists (FVEs), or others, based on their verified affiliation with insurgent or terrorist groups.

**As you can see, the total number of FRs and FVEs (50) is the same as that of the total number of JAPIC Certified surrenderers in Item I (50). Meanwhile, the number under “Others” is the same as that of the total number of Not Qualified under Item I (20). This table does not account for the JAPIC Backlog, nor those that have undergone JAPIC authentication procedures but are yet to receive their results as they have not been verified nor marked unqualified.*

Among the 50 JAPIC-certified surrenderers in FY 2023 Q3, 30 were Former Rebels (FRs), with 15 from the New People's Army (NPA) and 15 from the Militia ng Bayan (MB), while 20 were Former Violent Extremists (FVEs), including 10 from the Maute Group, 5 from the Bangsamoro Islamic

Special Note: It needs to be emphasized that firearms can only be compensated if the surfacing individual is officially enrolled in the ECLIP-IS, which entails additional requirements such as the JAPIC and the ECLIP Enrollment Form, among others. **However, such determination does not necessarily render an application to be a delay, unless such request has lapsed the prescribed period of two (2) days processing in the DILG ECLIP-PMO.**

However, as an alternative, the report may instead present the number of firearms eligible for remuneration against the total number of surrendered firearms.

Objective: To provide summary of surrendered firearms under the ECLIP, categorizing them based on JAPIC certification status and eligibility for remuneration.

Data Parameters:

- **Reporting Period** – Timeframe cover by the report

This table presents a summary of the surrendered firearms for remuneration under ECLIP, categorizing them based on JAPIC Certification status and eligibility for remuneration.

In **FY 2023 Q3**, **60 firearms** were surrendered, with **67% eligible for remuneration—30 already compensated, 5 in processing, and 5 awaiting disbursement.** Meanwhile, **17% are pending JAPIC certification, and 17% are ineligible.** While disbursement is progressing, delays in JAPIC certification and fund release should be addressed to ensure timely compensation.

- **Total Firearms Surrendered** – The overall count of firearms turned-in by surrenderers.
- **Eligible for Remuneration (JAPIC Certified)** – Number of firearms surrendered by individuals who have completed JAPIC authentication and are officially enrolled in ECLIP-IS.
 - **Received Compensation** – Firearms for which remuneration has been disbursed.
 - **Processing Compensation** – Firearms that are enrolled in ECLIP-IS and are currently being processed.
 - **Awaiting Disbursement** – Firearms eligible for remuneration but are not yet encoded in ECLIP-IS.
- **Pending JAPIC Certification** – Firearms from individuals undergoing JAPIC authentication but not yet certified.
- **Not Eligible**– Firearms from individuals who do not meet (a) JAPIC or (b) DILG-Administered Package of Assistance requirements.

Instructions:

2. To ensure the correctness of reported data, the number of eligible firearms is cross-checked with DILG ECLIP's official record of remunerated firearms. Any discrepancies between these figures shall be flagged for further review, helping to identify possible errors, delays, or process inefficiencies.
