As a Title 1 School, Remington Elementary would like to invite parents to participate in the various activities and developing plans of improvement. We know that full community and family support is essential in helping students achieve their highest potential.

- Throughout the school year, Remington Elementary will host multiple family events. These events are designed to foster family involvement. These events involve a variety of activities, which include problem-solving, reading, communication, writing, and early learning exploration. Through these events, parents are able to experience learning milestones and gain knowledge of their child's academic performance and ways they can help increase this.
- Communication with families and the community is updated daily highlighting school events and experiences. Classroom teachers communicate with parents weekly through SeeSaw, emails, phone calls, DoJo and newsletters. Title 1 updates and information is provided on the school website.
- Each year, parents of students receiving Title 1 funds will receive a survey to give feedback on the program and services provided to their child. This information will be reviewed by the school building leadership team (BLT).
- The school site council, which is made of parents, community members and staff will discuss the use of Title 1 funds and the services being offered to students.
- Parent and teacher conferences are held twice a year. At these conferences, assessments, progress monitoring and interventions are shared with parents.
- Parents are given weekly reports on reading interventions.
- During our Annual Title 1 Meeting (October) the Title 1 Coordinator will explain the Title 1 Program, its requirements, and the parents' right to know documents. A copy of the District Parent Involvement Policy will also be available at this time.
