Sample 1

So, take a critical look at your CV now and apply accordingly

You would be doing yourself a disservice to submit a CV that mentions the Language the employers wants only once in the skill section with no appearance in the experience or accomplishments.

A letter to job seekers (3)

Dear job seeker,

There's one more thing that can also give you an edge in job search : your experience level

There are three main types of experience levels

Entry level – 0-2 years

Mid-level/Intermediate – 3-8 years

Senior –level 8 years and above

Most times the level of experience stated by an employer determines

Your pay

Workload

Now, this could be lengthy, stick with me.

As I promised in an earlier email

I'll be talking about those with little or no experience first then moving to those with mid/senior level

First off, if you have little or no experience, you need to get some. Fast.

You can do this by applying for student and graduate internships

But to be honest, your best bet is volunteering your services or unpaid internship because those are readily available and the employers are more ready to teach you more about the field of study

You don't need to find a large firm and volunteer.

Look around you find somewhere to learn more about your field of study

For example, you studied pharmacy you can look around you for certified pharmacy and offer you services for free.

You don't need to wait for an opening in a hospital, chances are, and they'll want someone with more experience anyway.

So, you see at this level of experience, your concern should be less about the money you'll be paid but where can I grow and get something to spice up your CV? Increase my experience? Learn more and grow?

You tutored your younger ones at home during Covid- 19 outbreak? And now you are applying for a teaching job and feel you have no experience? You do: Home lesson teacher.

It could be remote; you could go only twice a week, go five days a week, it doesn't matter.

As long you have to work with at least one person, and have a work goal to meet, it's an experience. Build on it, reads books, polish it and add to your CV

Also as someone with no experience you have to be confident about your abilities even though you apply for only entry level jobs, trust yourself to learn and be able to add value.

These helps during a job interview as it tends to shine through if you doubt yourself.

Most times for entry level positions employers are concerned about who seems more intelligent, who is a quick learner, teachable, has a strong work ethic/is a hard worker and has more experience than others.

Now to midlevel/senior level work experience

You have the advantage of experience

Now all you need are two things.

One, have the experience the employer needs

Two, display this to full effect in your CV

Make sure keywords in your CV, matches the ones in the job description and show you're experienced in the day-to-day activities the job will require the accomplishments you achieved in your last position.
