Jolly, and area experts to prepare for the Regional and State Competitions. Winning teams from each state and province advance to the NorthAmerican Envirothon for an opportunity to compete for recognition, scholarships, and prizes. Teams begin to organize in November. Field trips and practices begin in January. Regional competition is held in April.

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**Application Process:**

If you are interested in applying as a mentor for the freshman mentoring program, you must meet the following criteria:

- You agree to attend all mandatory events and activities. It will be your responsibility to work out your schedule and be in attendance. Dates and times for events and activities will be given to you well in advance of the events.
- You will participate in all Freshman Mentoring events and activities fully and with a positive attitude. If at any time, you are suspected of not upholding the positive mission of the Freshman Mentoring program you will be subject to removal.
- You must agree to the Highlands High School Freshman Mentoring Program Code of Conduct and Ethics.

Completed applications, including a personalized video submission, are due in April (specific due dates will vary each school year). Details about the application process to be posted in Schoology Class Announcements during March of each school year. The selection committee reviews applications and teacher feedback as part of the application process. Mentors will be notified about the status of their application during May.

**Information:**

The mission of the Freshman Mentoring Program is to help assist incoming freshman students with a successful transition into high school. All incoming freshman students will be provided a mentor (10-12th grader). Mentors will be responsible for various activities to help welcome our freshman students.

### Information:

A practice schedule for this activity will be set at the beginning of the season by each coach. Attending weekly practices as well as independent practices is required. The season runs from early September through March. Students may choose to participate in one to three of the following events:

- **Drama/Acting Events-** Duo Interpretation, Dramatic Interpretation, Humorous Interpretation, Improvisational Duo, Poetry, POI, Prose, and Storytelling.
- **Speech Events-** Broadcasting, Declamation, Original Oratory, Extemporaneous Speaking, Informative, and Impromptu Speaking.
- **Lincoln Douglas Debate-** L-D Debate is a traditional one-on-one debate about contemporary controversial topics. The debate structure is based upon the Civil War era Lincoln Douglas debates. L-D Debate is the form of debate with which most people are familiar.
- **Public Forum Debate-** PFD is debate in which teams of two affirm or refute a resolution about both local and global dilemmas. The team works together to develop arguments and counter-arguments and then present their arguments and respond to their opponents' critiques.

Juniors and seniors who complete four or five years of German are eligible for the Honor Cord, which they wear at graduation as a special recognition for completing more than the basic requirement of a World Language and successfully completing the AP German course.
