Southwest RESA School Climate/MTSS Planning Committee Update September 25, 2024

The SW RESA department of School Climate/MTSS falls under GaMTSS which incorporates MTSS and PBIS under the Office of Whole Child Supports in GaDOE. There are three general ways to be supported by GaMTSS and SWRESA School Climate/MTSS:

 GaMTSS—two districts are participating in Professional Learning and Coaching for three years.

> Pelham City, Cohort 1 (began FY24) Mitchell County, Cohort 2 (began FY25)

 State Personnel Development Grant (SPDG) provides professional learning and coaching for three years in the area of adolescent literacy, grades 4-8. This federal grant flows through Special Education and efforts must include students with IEPs but is encouraged for all students in those grades.

 Continued PBIS implementation with support from SW RESA School Climate Support Specialists
