We adopt the same Athlete safety policy by USA archery, archers who were assigned a male sex at birth must compete in male categories. In the interest of increased competition, females may choose to register in male classes. However, must remain there once that selection is made Gender-neutral offered are: Universal Draw, Traditional, Adult Recurve and Senior Barebow.

DISCIPLINE DEFINITIONS

Disciplines:

- *Compound (any sight/scope/stabilizers)
- *Bowhunter (12" front bar, no magnification)
- *Traditional
- * Barebow
- *Olympic Recurve
- *Universal Draw Class (must use Genesis-standard arrows and bow set ups

Guidelines for classes:

- *No magnification for bowhunter classes
- *Sight adjustments ARE allowed in any classes (as long as it can be done in the time frame available on the shoot clock/while scoring)
- *No restriction on back bars
- *Arrows no larger that 27 series
- *Bowhunter front bar not to exceed 12" from front of riser (this includes quick disconnect)
- *Barebow tabs are permitted to have a metal plate; String walking is allowed for barebow. In traditional class, string walking or fixed crawls are not allowed. Both categories must shoot with fingers (gloves and tabs are permitted). No sights or marks on bow nor string, which may used for sighting marks. Finger must touch arrow for traditional.
- *Barebow must be able to pass through inspection ring.
- *Clickers are not allowed in barebow or traditional. However, elevated rests are permitted in both.
- *Traditional -No Quiver, stabilizers, weights attached to traditional bows; no plungers and rest/side plates cannot be adjustable.
- *Recurve: May have front or back stabilizers of any length.
- * Recurve: No magnification permitted.
- * Recurve: riser or sight mounted clickers permitted.
- *No lighted nocks will be allowed
- *Any traditional bow not meeting requirements can be shot in the barebow category instead.

Classes/Distances (Age determined as of Jan. 1, 2026)

Pee Wee (under age 6) *SHOOTS AT 10 YARDS - If needed, these bales can be shot at 7 yards. We plan on using the bales at the specified distance that is listed on their standings. Let us know if that's an issue.

Jr. Eagle (6-8 years old) *SHOOTS AT 10 YARDS

Eagle (9-11 years old) *SHOOTS AT 10 YARDS

Youth (12-14 years old) *SHOOTS AT 20 YARDS

Young Adult (15+ - Must still be enrolled in secondary school)

*SHOOTS AT 20 YARDS

Adult classes (Any post-secondary students or those who are not in high school)
*SHOOTS AT 20 YARDS

*Any archer must participate in the gender group, which they were classified at birth. The only exception is mixed gender classes.

TARGET INFORMATION

- *Target used will be the World Face 3 vertical TRIANGLE or 40 cm single spot Anyone can choose to shoot a one spot if desired.
- *All amateur classes will be using the standard 10-ring/x target (not the 'baby x' target)
- * FOR THE GAUNTLET ONLY Advanced compound class will change to the "Baby x" target to be scored as 10 (x) or 9 there will be no 11s. During the regular season, Advanced Compound will shoot the same target as the rest of the competitors.
- *10 yard classes onlyTarget center will be 40" from the floor for all qualifier tournaments TARGETS WILL BE STRAIGHT ACROSS THE MIDDLE OF THE TARGET no upper or lower targets
- *20 yard classes targets will be AB on top; CD on bottom. We will not switch out as we are only shooting 30 arrows
- ***** Targets can be changed at any time either at the request of the archer, or at the discretion of the lane official or judge
- *Targets will be lined up as A C B D. A & C will be on the outside of a 3-target layout . This will allow 4) 3-spots to be placed across a bale and matches automated clocks.

With this, A and B will shoot the A (or first line; C and/or D will shoot the second line.

Change as of Oct. 8, 2025

ATTENTION:

To continue our alignment with USA Archery and the collegiate archery world, our members were polled last night and overwhelmingly voted to go on and change to the Triangle 3-Spot for the 2025-2026 season instead of waiting for 2026-2027.

This change only affects those who had previously shot the 3-spot vertical - and those tournaments already in process may have to use their verticals until the new triangles can be received. **ANYONE CAN CHOOSE TO SHOOT EITHER 1 or 3***

Those who wish to continue to use the vertical for the 2025-2026 season may do so as the size and scoring of the targets are identical.

With this change - all 20 yard classes will go to a 4-target bale set up with AB on top and CD on bottom. WE WILL remain with a 30-arrow round and, like USA/Collegiate, positions will NOT flip halfway. We will NOT switch shooting order each round.

** ALL 10 yard classes will remain with 2 archers per bale with targets on the 40" from floor center line (NO top/bottom targets)

For the 2025-2026 season, archers may elect to use a triangle or vertical 3 spot

TOURNAMENT FORMAT

- *Archers will have two minutes to shoot 3 arrow end.
- *We will be shooting a 30 arrow x will score as an "11" (330 round)
- *In the event that more than one arrow is shot in one of the 3-spots, all arrows will count.
- *Archers may compete in different equipment categories. (IE: Compound and Recurve)
- *All archers must use hip quivers or ground quivers during the tournament.
- *If an archer is struck by another competitor on the line (by arrow, bumped on line, etc), a line judge may allow a reshoot of that arrow with a warning issued.
- *Electronic scoring and paper scorecards will be used. Scorecards MUST be legible, filled out completely, totaled and signed. Changes must have been made during tournament must be initialled by archers and a line judge.
- *Shooters that shoot at least THREE of their circuit's tournaments (for a max score of 990) will be qualified for the National Tournament. Circuits may have up to six shoots, so an archer can miss or drop scores if they shoot more than three. These scores will be combined nationally, for their national ranking score max 990).
- *Awards will be presented at each qualifying tournament for top 3 individuals in each class these awards may be available for pick up at the next tournament there will be no awards ceremony at each event
- *Team awards during qualifiers will be presented at each qualifying tournament (Pee Wee team, Jr. Eagle, Eagle, Youth, Young Adult and Adult). Must have five shooters to qualify award will be on the top 5 cumulative score. No show scores do not count on team scores.

To be eligible for national awards, you must have competed in the required number of qualifiers and participate in the actual Gauntlet. Your placement going into the Gauntlet will be forfeited if you do not actually take the stage. *National team award will be based on the full-team scoring Point totals will be counted for all competition classes. Exhibition classes (Pee Wee and Awesome Archers) will not count in this total. Points will be awarded as follows: 10 points for 1st place, 8 points for 2nd place, 6 points for 3rd place, 5 for 4th, 4 for 5th, 3 for 6th, 2 for 7th and 1 for any archer shooting in the Gauntlet in 8th place or below. (This is when there are more than 8 folks in the Gauntlet for some reason.) No show competitors placements will not count on team scores.

***TO BE AWARDED ANY NATIONAL HONORS YOU MUST PARTICIPATE IN THE GAUNTLET DURING NATIONALS WEEKEND

In the event of a no -show the archer is removed from the Gauntlet line up, is ineligible for their placement and no team points are awarded

**Last Chance tournament score must be completed the day PRIOR to the class's schedule shoot time in the Gauntlet to allow all the changes in seeding and Bowscore to be made.

FOR THE GAUNTLET ONLY - *Due to the nature of the competition, no break-down time is available for Gauntlet shooters; having a back up bow on hand is permissible due to that fact
