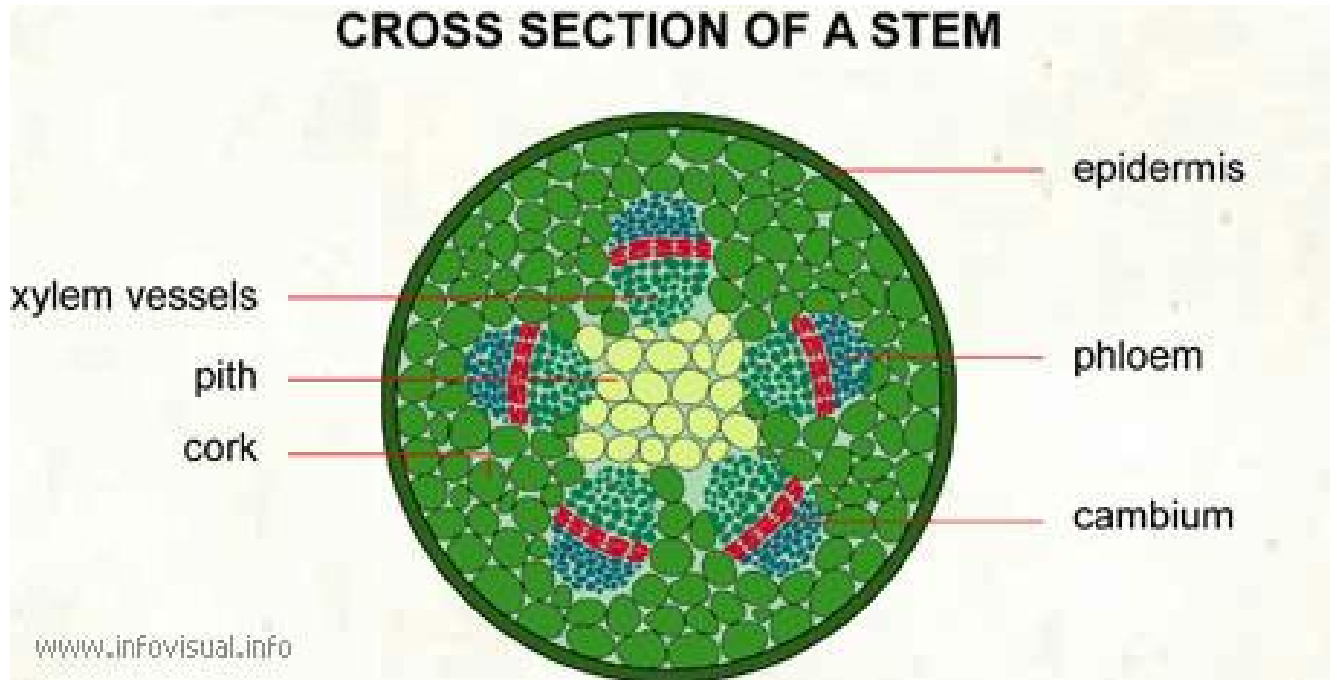
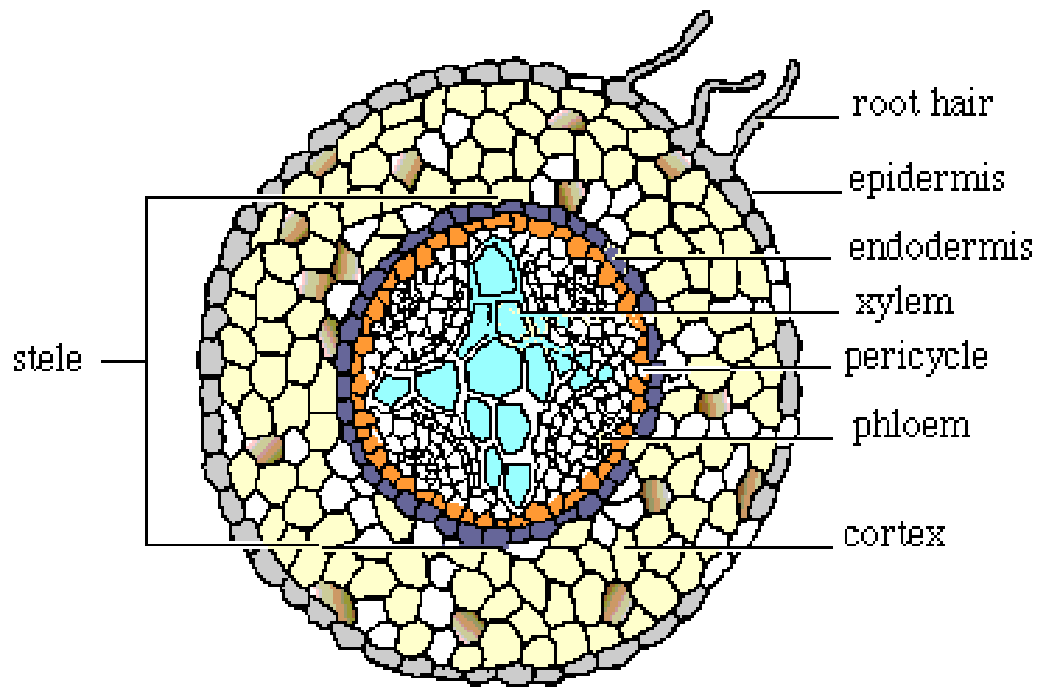


## Root, Stem, Leaf and Flower

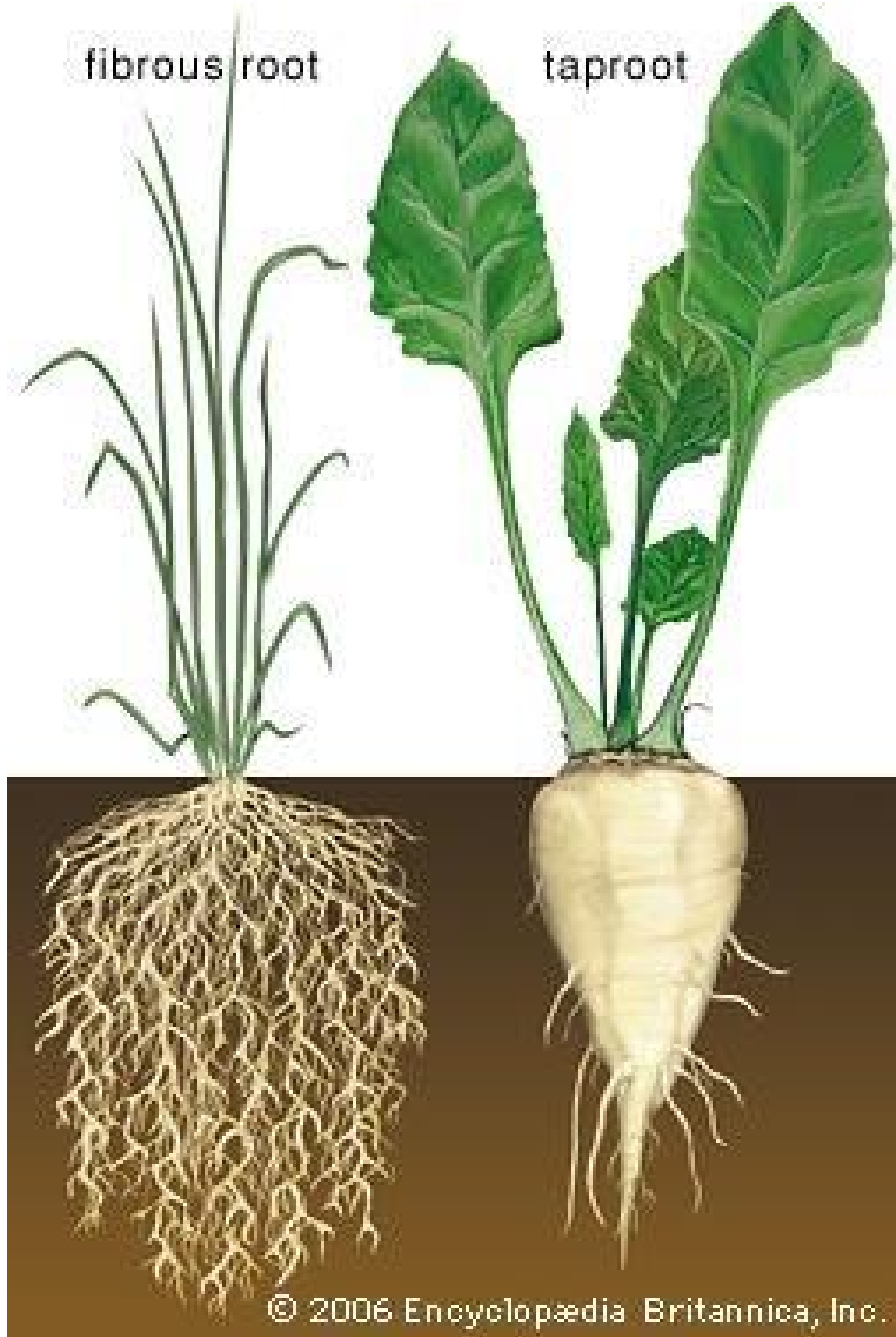


Roots

 <b>flower</b>	contains the reproductive parts of the plant
 <b>flower</b>	produces seeds
 <b>stem</b>	holds the plant up
 <b>stem</b>	carries water and nutrients from the roots to the leaves
 <b>leaves</b>	contain a substance called chlorophyll
 <b>leaves</b>	produce food for the plant
 <b>roots</b>	hold the plant in the ground
 <b>roots</b>	absorb water and nutrients from the soil
