Course Description:

Through this course students will develop and enhance their computer literacy skills to gain Microsoft Office Specialist certifications. Microsoft Office software is used by the majority of businesses to capture, create and share information about and within the organization. Programs such as PowerPoint, Word, Excel and Access help organizations manage information and manipulate data in order to achieve their business goals. Students have the opportunity to earn multiple Microsoft Office Specialist certifications for the different office programs listed above. MOS certifications validate a student/employees technology skill set to future employers and can aide a student in securing employment.

**Certification exams will be given after each Office software is learned. Students will also be able to take them during Final Exams OR complete a retake during Final Exams.

Summative Reassessment Procedure: (Timeframe, qualifications, etc.)

Minimum/Maximum Waiting Period: A minimum of one week must pass after the assessment is graded before a retake or redo is permitted. For example, if you received feedback on an assignment on Wednesday the 1st, the earliest the assessment retake is available would be Wednesday the 8th. Students will then have a maximum of one week

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following the Minimum Waiting Period (i.e. two weeks total from initial assessment) to complete the reassessment.

Relearning Requirement: Students must engage in relearning activities before attempting a retake or redo.

End-of-Semester Assessments: Any assessments conducted during the last three weeks of the semester are not eligible for retakes or relearning opportunities.

Summative Projects: Summative Projects where feedback is given along the way will not be allowed a retake. These assessments are marked with an * above in the *Timeline for Summative Assessments* section.
