I like it. It does not remove facial oils so I still clean my masks with baby shampoo periodically before putting them back in the soclean. There is a strong ozone odor after the soclean is done so I turn on the CPAP for a while before I use it to blow out the smell. Works like a charm. No more water sports in my bathroom trying to wash out the tubing.

Im a long haul trucker and am trying to find something that works while on the road

no liquids at all. Just pop the mask in, shut the lid and let it sit for 2 hours. You can use wipes to remove facial oils from the mask. There is a smaller soclean 2go that might fit better in your rig.

Ed It does work. We use it to sanitize all of our rentals. Not a huge fan of the 2GO unit, we've had many returns....

I've used one since i beta tested the unit 5 years ago. You still have to remove skin oils and such from the mask....just to keep it from feeling gross over time and to prolong the integrity of the seal.

The studies confirm its effectiveness to kill just about everything. The biggest culprit of sinus issues is the pink you may see grow in your tub.

The likelihood that you can transfer a virus or bacteria back into the tubing against the pressure and flow of the machine is very very very low. Its dirty masks and chambers that get you sick



I've been using one for about 8 months and really like it. It's expensive, and it has both fans and critics. I for one am happy with my purchase and the simplified daily routine that came with it (I just drop in the mask and hit a button). It doesn't entirely eliminate washing the mask as you still need to use soap and water for the parts that come in contact with skin—but that's now a weekly thing for me rather than a daily thing. As with everything with CPAP, YMMV
