Aspen Student Permissions Updated

Parents and guardians have the ability in Aspen to modify their students' permissions through their demographic verification form for military recruiting. If you wish to opt out of releasing student information to Military recruiters, you can check the box next to this option on the left-hand side. **Please complete this modification by Wednesday, October 15th.**

AP Exam Registration: Register by October 31 For Spring Exams

Students must register for all AP exams no later than October 31, 11:59 pm. The cost of each exam is \$115. After October 31, the College Board imposes a mandatory late fee, which will add \$42 to the cost of each exam.

Here are some signs to look for to determine if your child might benefit from mental health support:

Changes in mood or behavior

- Changes in eating or sleeping patterns
- Declining academic performance
- Withdrawal from friends or activities
- Increased anxiety or stress
- Expressing feelings of sadness or hopelessness
- Experiencing transition (related to life, family, peers, school)
- Exposure to a traumatic event


Unified Basketball


