

Financial Aid

1. Complete the current FAFSA Application. Completing the FAFSA application will also help you receive other scholarships and grants. Get started at fafsa.gov (This website does not have an application fee).

If you are unable to complete the FAFSA application, email finaid@otech.edu or come to our financial aid office (Student Services Room 126) for assistance. To complete the FAFSA you will need to gather:

- federal taxes
- W-2 forms
- Child Support paid or received

If you are new (never applied prior), you will need an FSA ID.

*When you get to the “Financial Information” section of the FAFSA, please use the IRS Data Transfer (IRS DRT) if possible. When you use this, your information will be transferred from the IRS website automatically onto your FAFSA. *Don’t forget to return to the FAFSA and finish the application.*

For your information to be received at this college, you must enter the SCHOOL CODE 015526

Complete your application by hitting the “Submit” button.
