The abstract begins with the research objective, followed by the research purpose, research results, and conclusions if applicable. All keywords listed in the keyword section must appear in the abstract.

Acknowledge : If acknowledgments are included, they should be limited to institutions or organizations that provided funding for the research, without stating the amount of funding received.

Declaration of conflicts of interests: No potential conflict of interest was reported by the authors.



Introduction

The article is written with 2.54 cm margins on all sides, using Cambria font size 11 pt with 1.5 line spacing. The entire body of the article, from the Introduction to the Conclusion, must consist of a minimum of 2,000 words and a maximum of 4,000 words, including all citations, references, and tables. The reference list is arranged using APA format.

The introduction section begins with the urgency of conducting the research and is supported by previous studies related to the topic discussed. Literature review support is placed in the introduction section with a minimum of 3 international references and 5 national journal articles published within the last 5 years. References older than 5 years may still be used but do not count toward fulfilling the initial reference requirements and are considered supplementary references.

Equations are written separately from paragraphs, centered, with equation numbers placed at the end (right side). Formulas are presented accordingly.

Research Methods

The research method section contains a paragraph-based description of the research design, data sources, data collection techniques, and data analysis actually carried out by the researcher, with a length of 10–15% of the total article. Each stage of the research is explained briefly and clearly. Every reference used must be cited. The research method section is typed using Cambria font size 11 pt with 1.5 line spacing.

Result and Discussion

A. Results

- 1. If the research results are divided into several subsections, they should be typed in Cambria 10 pt and in bold.**

The research results section presents the findings of the analysis related to the research questions. The research results may be supplemented with tables, figures, or graphs according to the following rules:

- a. Table

Table titles are numbered and placed above the table using Cambria font size 11 pt, single-spaced, with justified alignment and in bold. The table content uses Cambria font size 10 pt, single-spaced, and the table titles are numbered consecutively and written in bold.

The titles of graphs and figures are placed below the images, written using Cambria font size 11 pt, single-spaced, with centered alignment.

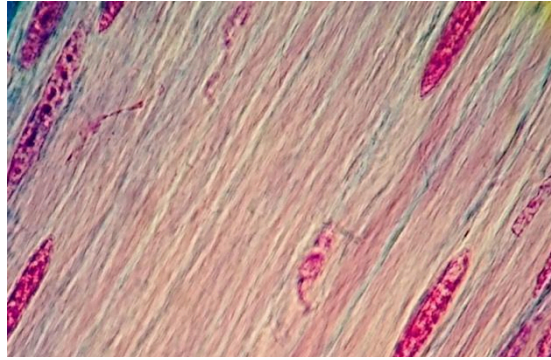


Figure 1. Cross-Section of Smooth Muscle Cells

Conclusion

The conclusion generally provides answers to the problem formulation or the objectives of the research. If the conclusion consists of two or more points, it should be written in numbered bullet points as shown in the example below.

The conclusion contains the research findings that answer the research questions or summarize the discussion results. It is typed using Cambria font size 11 pt with 1.5 line spacing. Based on the results of data analysis, the conclusions are presented as follows:
