DESCRIPTION OF THE DISCIPLINE

Objective: to develop students' knowledge and practical skills on topical issues of legal regulation of civil procedural relations: procedural status of subjects of civil procedural relations, organizational and legal framework for ensuring civil procedure, procedural aspects of consideration and resolution of civil cases by stages and proceedings, as well as enforcement of court decisions.

Objectives: to develop students' practical skills in solving problems related to the implementation of civil procedure legislation, working with regulatory documents and writing procedural documents.

As a result of studying the discipline, students should:

Know:

- basic principles of civil procedure;
- the structure of courts of general jurisdiction, their competence, jurisdiction and jurisdiction over civil disputes;
- stages and procedure for resolving civil disputes;
- execution of decisions, rulings, resolutions of the court of general jurisdiction in civil disputes;

be able to:

- interpret and apply the norms of the Constitution of Ukraine, civil procedural and substantive law, resolutions of the Plenum of the Supreme Court of Ukraine;
- make informed procedural decisions in disputed procedural situations;
- prepare claims, statements of claim and other procedural documents.

Acquisition of competencies:
