

Free School Meals for All

Partner toolkit: CLP Motion

This Labour Party Notes:

- 1. The current eligibility criteria for free school meals are entirely inadequate, meaning that on average one in three children living in poverty in England cannot access the provision.
- 2. There is an ever-growing body of evidence demonstrating universally provided free school meals benefit children's health, attainment, behaviour, lifetime earnings, local economies, families' budgets, and staff working conditions.
- 3. A <u>cost-benefit analysis of expanding free school meals</u>, carried out by PwC, shows a significant return on investment: universal provision could generate £99.5bn for the economy over its first 20 years.
- 4. Scotland, Wales and London are all rolling out universal free school meals.
- 5. Labour Party Conference 2022 passed <u>an emergency motion</u> in support of universal free school meals.

This Labour Party Believes:

- 1. That providing free school meals to all children would improve their health and educational outcomes and reduce inequalities.
- 2. That, like in hospitals, prisons, military settings, and other public places where the state provides food, the state has a moral responsibility to feed those it requires to be in schools.
- 3. That it is unjust to means test children for this one part of the school day.
- 4. That providing universal free school meals is a right and economically virtuous investment in our future generations.

This Labour Party Resolves:

1. To campaign for universal free school meals, as per the Labour Party Conference 2022 Emergency Motion.

- 2. To campaign for sufficient investment accompanying any expansion of free school meals, to cover the associated costs, including staff, food and energy.
- To write to the Prime Minister and Secretary of State for Education, calling on the government to invest in the next generation by providing fully government-funded, delicious, nutritious and sustainable school lunches for all school pupils of all ages in England.
- 4. To call on our MP to support all calls for universal free school meals, including our own, and to speak in favour of the policy in Parliament.
