- 2023 SNIA Officer Nominations (:10)
 - Accepted nominations from the floor for 2023 executive officer positions for the neighborhood association. After tonight, nominations will be closed and there will be a vote by association members at the next neighborhood meeting scheduled for December 5. There was no vote tonight. If there are any positions without nominations, board members for the association can appoint officers. The earliest this will occur is at the January board meeting. And it will be done by a vote of board members.
 - As President-Elect this year, Stephanie Herbers will assume President role next year.
 - The six positions up for nomination are:
 - 1st VP, 2nd VP, Treasurer, Asst Treasurer, Secretary, Asst Secretary
 - Nominations were accepted during the meeting. There is one nomination each for 4 positions.

 - Asst Treasurer: No nominations
 - Secretary: Melissa Hill
 - Asst Secretary: Jen Tussey

- Dog Park Committee, Michael Maher
 - Added some lights to the park that are on from 5-10pm, starting small and adding to them over time. Do not want them to be too bright for neighboring houses, but would like some light for members as we approach winter and it gets darker earlier in the evening.
 - At the September board meeting, board members approved raising the dog park fees \$10 for Shaw residents (now \$50 a year) and \$5 for non residents (\$70 a year) in 2023. The fee is still one of the lower costs in the region and will help contribute to fundraising for more dog park improvements that the committee has started planning for. More information on improvements will be shared in the near future.

Alderwoman Annie Rice, 8th ward notes:

- Alderwoman Rice joined on Zoom after meeting adjourned.
- South Grand Traffic Meeting recap:
 - Grand is getting repaved with ARPA funds (along with other major roads). An opportunity for some immediate approaches.
 - Traffic calming around S Grand between Magnolia and Chippewa & reinforcing bike lanes
 - City officials also discussed enforcement of parking laws (parking lane) & traffic enforcement. For example, 249 tickets cited in September on Grand- mostly speeding and running lights.
 - Also looking into long term strategies.
 - At meeting, learned that Russell and Grand is a hot spot for accidents. Ald. Rice advocated for traffic work to be extended north to 44 for any work related to South Grand.
