
### Seal-A-Smile

### Native American Heritage Month



November is National Native American Heritage Month! Beginning Monday, November 10th, WDHS/WDMS/SHES/LDES will have a week-long opportunity to celebrate Indigenous peoples.

#### Monday, Nov. 10

To kick off our week-long celebration, we are starting with Neon Day. Wear your brightest colors to celebrate the bright and diverse cultures of Native America!

#### Tuesday, Nov. 11

In recognition of a national movement that advocates for the end of violence to Native American Women, WEAR RED! MMIW (Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women) movement aims to draw attention to the high rates of missing and murdered Native American people, particularly females. The U.S. Department of Justice found that 4 out 5 Native American women have faced violence and face murder rates that are 10 times higher than the national average. Or you are invited to wear your hair in braids. Many Native American cultures have beliefs and

customs about their hair. One of them is that a person's strength lives within their hair; this is why we don't touch other people's hair.

#### Wednesday, Nov. 12

Dress in the Ho-chunk traditional attire or simply wear your Dells Chiefs gear. Show pride in what a chieftain represents: humility, honor and integrity.







By changing the way we communicate a student's progress, we are able to provide better, more meaningful communication to parents and students about specific skills and standards being met or unmet. This progress is measured using rubrics, which clearly articulate what different levels of performance look like and provide parents and students valuable information about the student's progress and also a roadmap for growth. It is a much better way to communicate progress.

#### Weekly Recap:

We had a busy week here at WDMS! The structures and routines are beginning to take shape and classrooms are already full of learning! Be sure to check out the <u>WDMS Website</u> for all of your questions regarding WDMS.

This week, we conducted our first safety drill, an evacuation, of the school year and our students did an amazing job! Throughout the school year, we practice **safety drills** to prepare our students and staff to take action in the event of an emergency. These drills include:

#### Evacuations

- This drill is practiced and called to move students and staff from one location to another.
  - For example, we practice this type of drill in the event of a gas leak, fire, burst pipe, etc.

#### Administrative Holds

- This drill is practiced and called when the hallways need to be kept clear, even during class changes. With this drill, business continues on as normal in our classrooms with the doors locked. Students remain in their current classroom until given the "All clear" to pass again in the hallways.
  - For example, we practice this type of drill in the event of a medical emergency or another situation where we need to keep the hallways clear of students.

#### Lockdowns

- This drill is practiced and called when there is a threat or hazard inside the building. Students and staff move away from sight, maintain silence, and lock classroom doors. Think: Lock, Lights, Out of Sight.
  - For example, we practice this type of drill in the event of an intruder in the building.

#### Shelter Drills

- This drill is practiced and called when the need for personal protection is necessary.
  - For example, we practice this type of drill in the event of severe weather, such as a tornado in the area.
