Program Description

The Bachelor of Humanitarianism and Conflict Response, Minor in Faith-Based Humanitarian Response at HBIU University is designed to prepare students for careers in humanitarian aid, conflict resolution, and peacebuilding within both secular and faith-based organizations. This program offers students a comprehensive understanding of humanitarianism, conflict management, and spiritual care, equipping them to effectively respond to global crises with a focus on human dignity and faith-driven compassion. Students will explore the complex dynamics of conflict zones, poverty, and disasters, and develop the skills necessary to create lasting solutions through humanitarian aid and peacebuilding efforts.

Students will learn how to address human rights violations, aid displaced populations, and promote peace in regions affected by conflict, poverty, and natural disasters. The curriculum emphasizes practical humanitarian response strategies, international law, and faith-based approaches to conflict resolution, preparing students to make a tangible impact in real-world crisis situations. The program integrates academic learning with hands-on experiences, including case studies, simulations, and internships, allowing students to apply their knowledge in the field of humanitarian work and peacekeeping.

The Minor in Faith-Based Humanitarian Response enhances the program by training students to integrate biblical principles of compassion, reconciliation, and justice into their work. Students will learn how to incorporate faith-driven values into humanitarian aid efforts, using Christian teachings to guide their approach to conflict resolution and humanitarian intervention. The minor focuses on how faith-based organizations contribute to global peacebuilding and community healing, helping students understand the role of faith in addressing human suffering and rebuilding communities affected by conflict. Graduates will be equipped to serve in Christian humanitarian organizations, international NGOs, and peacebuilding initiatives, providing aid and spiritual support to vulnerable populations and fostering long-term reconciliation in crisis areas.
