

# Public and Community Health

Public and Community Health is a **1 year** two course pathway that provides the foundational knowledge and skills needed for students who intend to enter the public and community health field. Curriculum focuses on improving health and quality of life in personal, community, and the global population. Students will study the science of nutrition and learn about health issues connected to nutrition and wellness. Students will also analyze the impact of an aging society on the nation's health care system, while engaging in discussions of health decisions, individual rights, and social responsibilities.

A year of curriculum content is delivered in each semester. Because of this accelerated learning, each semester is worth 10 high school elective credits.

## PROGRAM OF STUDY SEQUENCE

### Health Science Foundations A-G College-Prep Elective

This is the first semester course in the two course sequence. This concentrator course exposes students to the major career fields and diverse career opportunities available in the healthcare field. It provides the foundational knowledge and skills needed to be successful in healthcare careers.

### Public Health A-G College-Prep Elective

This is the second semester course in the pathway. This capstone course focuses on improving health and quality of life in personal, community, and the global population. Students will examine core disciplines within public health including the epidemiology of infectious and chronic disease; prevention and control of diseases in the community; an analysis of the social determinants of health; strategies for eliminating disease, illness, and health disparities among various populations
