Unit 1: Early American Literature (Native American)

Week 5: September 8-12, 2025



This week students will prepare to take their Unit 1: Early American Literature (Native American Lit) test (next week), and they'll begin the writing process of their first formal essay, Essay #1: Native American Literary Elements found within Contemporary Literature/Media. We'll finish the reading of "The Earth on Turtle's Back" in the textbook, identifying Native American literary elements found within the creation story. Students will continue with the study of Level F, Unit 2 vocabulary words, and they should be working on their individualized grammar lessons (Quill #3).

*I will not be at school on Thursday or Friday this week; therefore, my AA will not be held on Thursday afternoon.

Learning Objectives:

- Use resources found within the online textbook effectively.
- Demonstrate an understanding of the conventions of standard English grammar and mechanics (Quill-Assignment #3).
- Identify characteristics of Native American origin stories.
- Trace the development of American literature from Native American origin stories to modern-day American fiction (*superhero origins)
- Identify literary elements reflective of Native American literature.
- Write arguments to support claims with clear reasons and relevant evidence *citing evidence from the text
- Define vocabulary words based on context clues and word parts (Level F, Unit 2).
- Identify synonyms and antonyms related to Level F, Unit 2.
