Public Art

Library and Auditorium Lobby Rotating Exhibit Project

In September, the Arts and History team issued a call for artists to create temporary art installations for the shared lobby and entrance area of the Broomfield Library and Auditorium. Artists were encouraged to explore unique imagery and seasonal themes suitable for all ages in a public space. Selected artists will have their pieces displayed in the shared lobby entrance for four months and will each receive a \$10,000 stipend.

In October, a selection panel chose three artists for the project: Rebecca Lefebvre, Amelia Furman & Heather Rubald, and Sophia Dixon Dillo. During the week of January 20, artist Sophia Dixon Dillo will install her piece,

Forming Light, in the shared lobby. The installation will be unveiled to the public on Saturday, January 25. Sophia's Forming Light will be on display until April, 2025.

2026 Auditorium Rental Calendar

The 2026 Auditorium rental calendar is now open for Broomfield-based organizations. These organizations can request dates for the 2026 calendar by completing the Broomfield Auditorium rental request form. The form was emailed to regular Broomfield-based renters on Monday, January 6. Reservations will be processed on a first-come, first-served basis.

If your Broomfield-based organization is interested in renting the Auditorium and did not receive the email invitation, please contact the Auditorium team at Auditorium@Broomfield.org. Non-Broomfield based organizations can start requesting 2026 dates in early March of 2025.
