On **Monday, October 27**, our grade 10 Civics students enjoyed a day in the inner workings of our government. Our first stop was an in-depth one-on-one session with our Senator Rebecca Patterson at the Senate on Sussex Street. Students were invited down to the Senate chambers where they sat in the seats of Senators and were free to

ask questions regarding the life of a Senator. Our next stop was the House of Commons where students sat in the gallery. Here students were free to listen in on a governmental debate. On this day, the debate was regarding Citizenship and Immigration. Students were quite engaged and did not want to leave curious as to how the discussion was going to end. #### WISE WITH DATA - INTRODUCTION TO CODING WORKSHOP

Machine learning drives automation, personalization and data driven decision making across a variety of industries. On **October 29**, Notre Dame students were hosted by Wise With Data Founder Ian Ghent, in the development hub in Gatineau. The day-long workshop enforced critical thinking, language acquisition and problem solving as foundational skills for future data engineers/scientists, software developers and cyber security specialists. The hands-on event has introduced the fundamentals of python and pyspark programming language.

# ONTARIO SECONDARY SCHOOL LITERACY TEST (OSSLT) - IMPORTANT DATES

**Monday, Nov 3:** Members of our Literacy Team will meet with all Grade 10s to explain test tools & navigation. Students will be given access to sign up for Learn and Lunch sessions on this day.

**Thursday, November 13:** Students will be given the opportunity to write the practice test in their Period 3 class.

**November 4, 6, 11 & 13:** Students will be given the opportunity to participate in voluntary lunchtime sessions to practice and prepare for the Literacy Test (must sign up in advance). **Tuesday November 18:** All eligible students will write the Literacy Test.

If you have a student who is in Grade 10, 11, or 12 this year, who will be writing the OSSLT, there are several ways in which they can prepare for the test:

- Students are encouraged to complete the online <u>Practice Test</u> which has an identical format to the OSSLT. Students will also be given direct instruction during class time during the month of November.
- If any students would like additional practice with literacy concepts through our Student Success Department, please ensure your student signs up for our Learn & Lunch Sessions on Monday Nov 3rd when our team meets with all grade 10 students to discuss the test

## **GO EAGLES!**

The excerpt below was taken from a personal essay written by grade 10 student, Lydia Assani. It was a response to an article published by a former ND student who is now studying journalism at Carleton.

Representation should be anywhere and everywhere. I never understood how much it meant to me until I came to Notre Dame High School. For the first time in my life, there were teachers my colour, people in clubs that shared similar experiences with me, and teenagers that share the same culture as me. Being around people who could see me for who I am, made me beyond comfortable. In the article, Iya Mendoza wrote; "but it just felt different being able to see myself in a stranger." That's exactly what I felt when I came to Notre Dame and saw people that were like me.
