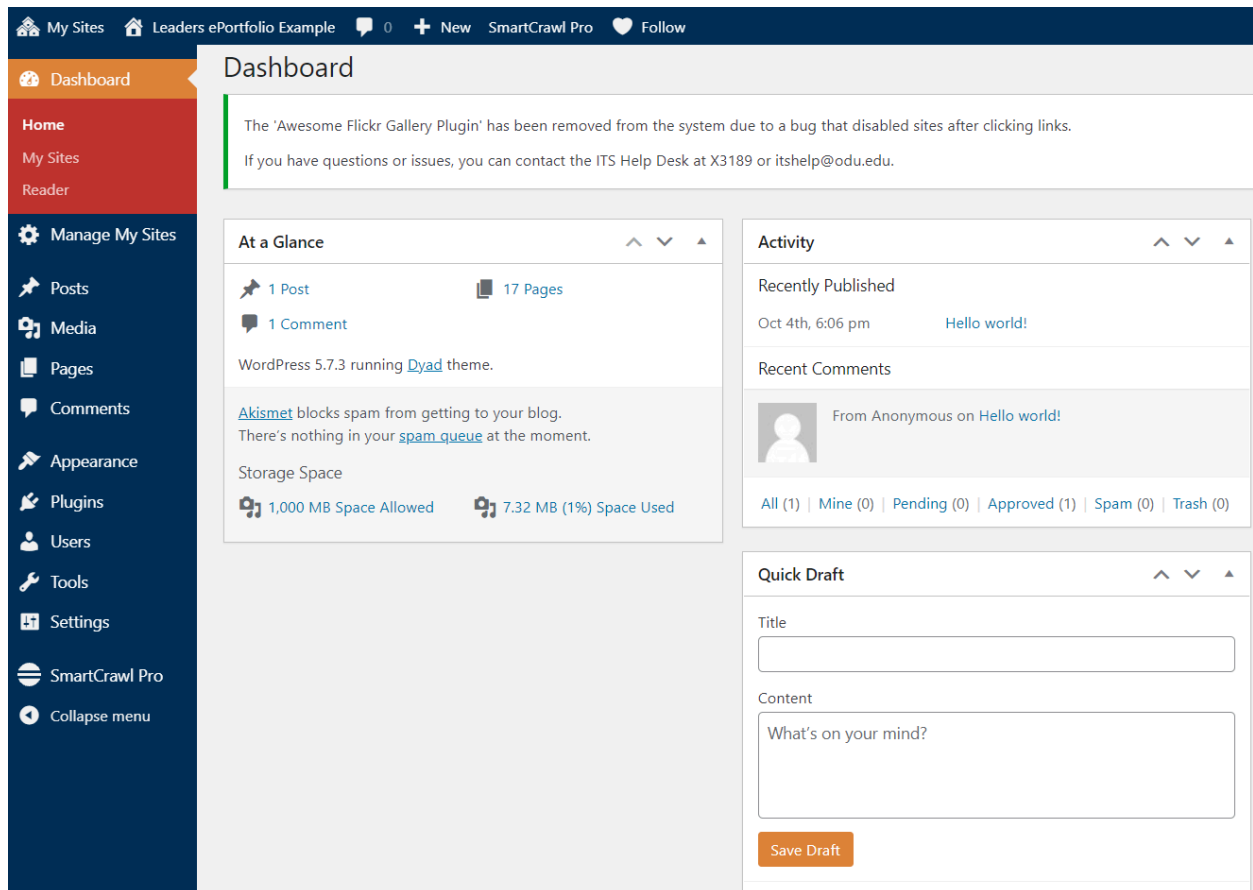




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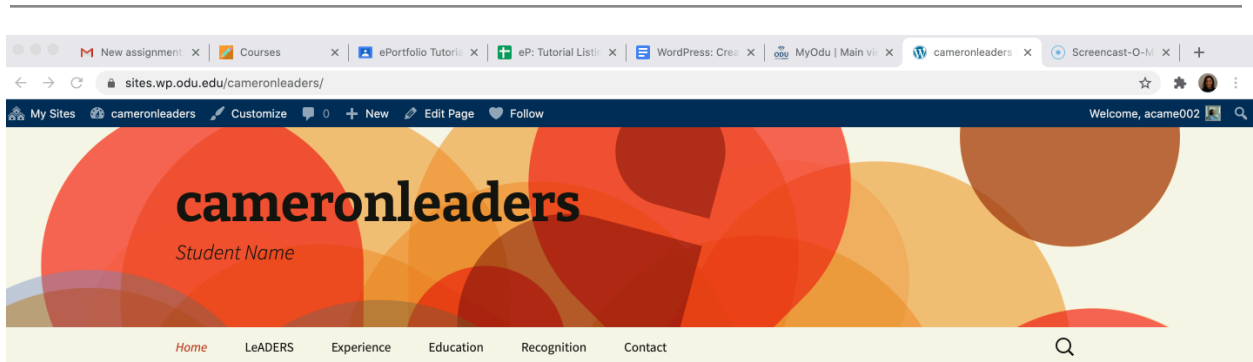
Creating Parent and Child Pages



Go to My Sites → Dashboard → Click “Visit Site” under the house icon with your site name.

Place some information about yourself on this page. You might include some background details, what your current goals are, or your status within your coursework. If you're comfortable, also include a photo of yourself (consider "wrapping the text" around this image to make the most effective use of space). Think of the Home page as the first meeting people will have with your digital identity. Make a good impression!

Click "Edit Page" at the top left of the page.

In WordPress, a page can be a 'Parent' or 'Child' if it holds other pages or is itself held. In order to assign a 'parent,' a page must first exist, and each page can only have a single 'parent' at any one time.

During the creation or updating of a page, a ‘parent’ can be assigned from the Page Attributes section. To locate the Page Attributes section, click on the gear button on the upper right-hand side of the page and scroll down.

Through selecting a parent for the page or post, it will be “under” its parent and show up in both the URL and listings as a child to that page. Make sure to hit the “Update” button at the upper right-hand side of the page when done.
