


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## Creating Parent and Child Pages



Go to My Sites → Dashboard → Click "Visit Site" under the house icon with your site name.



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
Click "Edit Page" at the top left of the page.

In WordPress, a page can be a 'Parent' or 'Child' if it holds other pages or is itself held. In order to assign a 'parent,' a page must first exist, and each page can only have a single 'parent' at any one time.



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## Assigning a Parent to a Page



During the creation or updating of a page, a 'parent' can be assigned from the Page Attributes section. To locate the Page Attributes section, click on the gear button on the upper right-hand side of the page and scroll down.

Through selecting a parent for the page or post, it will be "under" its parent and show up in both the URL and listings as a child to that page. Make sure to hit the "Update" button at the upper right-hand side of the page when done.
