## To Whom it May Concern:

Thank you for your recent statement in response to systemic racism and injustice in our community and across the United States. A public statement acknowledging these issues and a call for equity and justice in our schools is an important first step in creating change. As a community of educators, parents, and students, we want to make sure that your public statement is not the first and last step, but that your words are backed up with concrete plans and policy changes that will bring real change.

Racism is more than just individual acts of meanness. It shows up in the policies and practices that lead to disproportionality. Kindness and color-blindness will not heal the deep wounds or repair the deep ruts of racism. Therefore, while we appreciate the statement that the district made, we join together with <a href="SURJ-KC Education Core">SURJ-KC Education Core</a>, <a href="IUST Systems">IUST Systems</a>, <a href="Elements of Education KC">Elements of Education KC</a>, <a href="Kansas City Black Mental Health Initiative">Kansas City Black Mental Health Initiative</a>, <a href="Latinx Education Collaborative">Latinx Education Collaborative</a>, <a href="Brothers Liberating Our Communities">Brothers Liberating Our Communities</a>, <a href="SURJ-KC Families">SURJ-KC Families</a>, and <a href="Racial Equity EdConnect">Racial Equity EdConnect</a> to call on you to make a systematic and sustained commitment to equity in the following ways:

- Require all staff at all levels participate in anti-racist, anti-bias professional development for up to sixteen hours a year for the next five years (eight hours minimum). Avoid asking current BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, People of Color) staff to perform uncompensated emotional labor in these efforts; contract with skilled and BIPOC consultants to facilitate this work.
- 2) Strategically ask staff, who are over 80% white, to start by examining their own racial identity development (e.g. *Waking Up White, White Fragility, We Can't Teach What We Don't Know*). Equip your staff to facilitate courageous conversations about racism in the classroom (e.g. *Not Light, But Fire: How to Lead Meaningful Race Conversations in the Classroom*). At least 2 book studies /year, 75% staff proficient on equity survey (create)
- 3) Integrate culturally responsive and culturally congruent teaching in teacher training and evaluation processes. Create a new evaluation sheet by (deadline \_\_\_\_\_) to have looked over and given feedback from SURJ and surrounding constituents.
- 4) Implement restorative practices that replace traditional exclusionary discipline (in-school and out-of-school suspensions, buddy rooms, and more), in order to reduce the gaps of disproportionate suspensions (Consult #RJLeagueChat). Decrease your suspensions of black and brown children by 50% over the next 5 years.
- 5) Remove police presence and metal detectors from schools (see Denver, Minneapolis, Portland, Madison). Audit frequency of referrals to law enforcement from SROs (School Resource Officers), budget commitments, and arrest and search frequency by race. By 2022 all metal detectors will be removed and police will be replaced with counselors and social workers. Audit will take place 1/year.
- 6) Transform curriculum, school libraries, and classroom libraries to include diverse, representative, inclusive texts. Consult #DisruptTexts, #WeNeedDiverseBooks, tolerance.org, rethinkingschools.org, and zinnproject.org. Audit English curriculum in each grade level for people of color, increase percentage by 25%.
- 7) Modify recruitment, hiring, and retention practices for staff of color, and set goals for 30% BIPOC representation at all levels. Include BIPOC leaders in this process, leveraging community relationships if HR does not currently include any BIPOC leaders.

- 8) Ensure equitable representation in honors, Advanced Placement (AP), and gifted, as well as special education. Analyze referral and accessibility policies. Include BIPOC leaders in this process, leveraging community relationships if district leadership does not currently include any BIPOC leaders.
- 9) Begin offering high school courses in ethnic studies and history, such as Latinx history, Mexican-American history, African-American history, and Asian/Pacific Islander history. Take audit of high school and middle school curriculum. Increase amount of cultural history by 30%. Replace 30% of white history with another group. Include people of color's perspectives in 30% of the already existing curriculum.
- 10)Encourage and amplify leadership of students and parents of color. Create parent/school/community liaison administrative position. Create student admin liaison position and committee to include student voice.
- 11)Create leadership positions and revise budgets to make these action steps achievable. Audit budget and ensure minimum 35% is directly in reach of these goals.
- 12) Annually share data, disaggregated by race, related to each of these action steps. Agree to annual assessment to be made public about your institution and its growth towards equity.

As a follow-up to your initial statement, we expect a plan with action steps detailing how you will commit efforts and resources to support your stance on equity and justice. We expect you to not only work to change beliefs, but also to <u>change actions and systems</u>. We cannot wait any longer. All our students deserve an equitable and liberatory education.

We will be tracking each district's commitments to these action steps over the next two months, and comparing those to your initial equity statements. We look forward to hearing from you.
