Expectations:

Respect my right to teach and students' rights to learn. I will, therefore, not tolerate student behavior which keeps this from happening.

Remember - GIVE RESPECT/GET RESPECT

Class expectations include, but are not limited to:

- Students will pay attention, follow all directions, and stay on task
- Hats and sunglasses will be removed <u>before</u> entering the classroom
- No profanity or negative comments are allowed
- No leaving your seat without permission
- CHEATING is a serious offense and will be dealt with according to the student handbook
- Students displaying or using cell phones or MP3/iPod digital music players in the classroom or inappropriately
 will be subject to disciplinary measures and be considered in defiance.
- Cell phones may only be out in class if given permission by the teacher.
- All school rules apply

Behavior Steps and Consequences:

If a student chooses to break a rule, appropriate action will be taken. Depending on the severity of the infraction, this could include a verbal reprimand, classroom detention, call/email to parent, and/or a referral to the Assistant Principal.

Classroom disruption 1-2 verbal warnings and/or classroom detention will be given to student.

Classroom disruption 3-7+ see student handbook for consequences.

Attendance/Tardy Policy:

Due to the abundance of group work, class discussion, oral presentations, and in-class activities that cannot be duplicated outside the classroom, regular attendance is vital. Poor attendance will likely affect your students learning, and hence lower grades. All tardy numbers have a possible grade impact. Any work collected while a student is unexcused (tardy) will automatically be graded at 50% of the points they would have normally received.

Every instructional minute counts and student tardiness interferes with the learning process. Please be respectful of your teacher and fellow classmates and be on time to class.

A tardy is defined as arrival to class after the tardy bell rings. Students must be in their seats when the tardy bell rings. Teachers may give classroom consequences for tardies. Teachers will outline their consequences in their syllabi.

School Messenger will automatically phone parents alerting them each time their student is tardy. If you feel you have received a message notifying you of a tardy, in error, please contact your child's teacher.

Students who reach the following cumulative number of tardies in a semester will receive the following administrative consequence in addition to the teacher's consequence:

5	Administrative Meeting and parent contact
10	DART Contract for Tardies/ Loss of off campus pass.
11th Tardy or additional unexcused absence	In-House suspension
12+	Home suspension.

Arrival to class more than 30 minutes late will constitute a truant in addition to the tardy consequences.

Make-up/Late work Policy:

Students will have the same number of days that they were absent from school to make up their work for an excused absence. Late work is deducted by half the first day and to zero points after that. Assignments are late if assignment isn't turned in by period and day due. Students are allowed to make up work while suspended from school. When you are absent **IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY** to make arrangements for making up class activities, presentations, quizzes, assessments, or tests. In some cases, it may be necessary to use an alternative form of assessment. Unexcused absences cannot make up work per Ed Code 48205.

Grading Policy:

Your quarter/semester grade will be determined by the total points accumulated according to the following percentage basis. Grades are done as one continuous semester. Meaning students do not start over at quarter. (+ and – are assigned to grades)

90 -100% A 80 - 89% B 70 - 79% C 60 - 69% D 0 - 59% F

Grades are rounded up at .5%. (For example: a 79.5% is a B- and a 69.3% is a D+)

Your quarter/semester grade will be determined by the following weighted scale:
Test/Quiz 30% Assignments

Test/Quiz 30% Final 20%

-Note: A TA grade is based off his/her attendance. A TA must be in class 70% of the time.

Classwork/Homework (Assignments):

Assignments will be assigned on a day-to-day basis. Students are required to do all assigned work. All assignments will follow board policy 6145. Work will not be collected but it will always be checked. (Note, some assignments/projects have to be collected) So, as a parent, you can always check to see what work your child has done! Homework will always be due the next class period. Assignments are essential for practicing the concepts taught in class. Remember that homework isn't a punishment; it is a way to reinforce what you have learned.
