<p>UNST 421 Capstone: Learning from and About Persons with Disabilities</p> <p>PSU Senior Capstone</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● 6 credits ● Spring/Summer (2/4), or Summer registration (6) ● Junior standing required (90 completed credits towards BA/BS) 	<p>Most PSU undergraduates are required to complete the UNST Senior Capstone.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● This capstone is open to all students. At PSU, students can take more than one capstone. ● This capstone is highly recommended by advisors of students in Public Health, BA/BS in Social Work, Psychology, Biology. ● Speech & Hearing Sciences Majors, Pre-Education, Special Education: Excellent experience for applying to graduate school and/or employment in schools.. ● Students in the Special Education BA/BS Licensure program: Elizabeth Benner, SPED BA/BS advisor ebenner@pdx.edu can help students adjust your program of study to enroll and use financial aid effectively. <p>Using your financial aid effectively: Students can choose one of two registration options:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● enroll in 2 credits in Spring Term and 4 credits in Summer Term ● enroll in 6 credits in Summer Term <p>The Spring (2 credits)/Summer (4 credits) option allows you to place some of the credits (2 of the 6 credits) into Spring so the two credits are part of your academic year financial aid.</p>
<p>SPED 460: Outdoor ED/REC for Persons with Disabilities</p> <p>Undergrad Practicum</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● 6 credits ● Summer registration 	<p>This elective is open to all PSU undergraduates. Can be taken as a Freshman, Sophomore, Junior, or Senior.</p> <p>Great option for Freshman/Sophomores who want more experience as they choose their major and career path (teaching/counseling/health professions/ etc.)</p> <p>Great option for transfer or other student who needs/wants this experience but does not need capstone credits</p>
<p>SPED 560: Outdoor ED/REC for Persons with Disabilities</p> <p>Graduate Practicum</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● 6 credits ● Summer registration 	<p>This elective is open to teachers and other individuals who have completed their BA/BS degree and would like this experience for graduate credit.</p> <p>Teachers can select this option to gain additional post-licensure credits for advancement in their school district.</p>
