How we Communicate

We want to keep you informed. There are many ways we communicate with families and students:

 MacJournalism - Our journalism program keeps us all informed through their MacJ posts on Instagram (@macjournalism). They rarely miss an event or an important

- announcement. Note: if you don't have an Instagram account, the MacJournalism posts are worth getting an account and just following their posts.
- **Blend Announcements** Depending on the nature of the announcement, students and parents will receive Blend Announcements.
- Morning Announcements Our Mac Student Council does morning announcements, as well as a moment of silence and pledges, at the beginning of 2nd and 6th periods.
- MacKnightly eNewsletter Our wonderful Mac PTSA sends out a weekly newsletter
 called the MacKnightly Newsletter with important announcements. To sign up to

- **Principal Update** I send a Principal Update (like this one) once a month. It serves to connect and highlight important information.
- Emails and Texts through School Messenger School Messenger is the system used by AISD to send group emails and text messages. Occasionally, parents have accidentally opted out of receiving these by indicating they would like their email made private. To check your settings, go to your Portal, click on the tile "Frontline SIS Self-Serve", click on the tab "Edit Contact Info", and scroll down to check that you have indicated "No" to making your email private (unless, of course, you'd like to opt out of emails)
 - We will be switching to a new platform known as Thrill Share. This new platform should be more user friendly than the old school messenger system.

What to do if (when) my student has a concern in the classroom?

We are in the business of people. We can expect that there will be differences of opinion, misunderstandings, confusion in communication, etc. What do you do when something happens? Please follow these steps when addressing a concern or misunderstanding.

- **STEP 1:** As often as possible, we want our students to practice advocating for themselves. The first step in addressing a concern is to encourage your student to speak with their teacher. Most problems can be resolved at this level and it is great practice for students to become advocates in their own lives.
- **STEP 2:** If you and your student feel there is still an issue, please email your teacher directly. You can find their contact information in the <u>AISD Directory</u> or by emailing through the Parent Portal Frontline Self-Service.
- **STEP 3:** The best next step is for the student or their parent to reach out to their support team of AP and/or counselor to help resolve the problem
- **STEP 4:** If you feel like your concern has not been addressed then please contact Mr. Baxa the school principal.

Period Products at Mac



Drop Off & Pick Up at Mac

Sunshine Drive is used by AISD buses to drop off and pick up students who ride the bus. Because of this, Sunshine Drive from Houston to Stark is off limits to private transportation pick up in the afternoon. Our recommendation is that you communicate with your student a rendezvous location along Houston St. or Grover Ave. We don't recommend that students cross the street to get to their pick up vehicle. The traffic seems to be worse the first couple weeks of school. Let's be patient and treat each other with civility as we get our students home safely.



My child has a doctor's appointment. How do I pick them up early from McCallum?

Parking is limited and our school is very spread out. We want to make the process of picking up your child early as simple as possible. Here is the easiest way to pick your child up early for an appointment:

- 1. Send a note the day before the anticipated absence with your student. We can only accept notes from the parent/guardian listed in our system. The note should include:
 - a. Reason for leaving
 - b. Time leaving
 - c. Student ID#
 - d. Parent/guardian phone number
 - e. Parent/guardian signature
- 2. Your student should take the note to the office before school (or at their earliest convenience).
- 3. Your student must check out via Raptor in the main office.
- 4. After checking out your student may be picked up by the flagpoles.

- 5. If the student will return to school the same day, they will need to check back in via Raptor in the main office.

Legislative Update - HB 114

Teen vaping has become a major public health concern in recent years. The use of electronic cigarettes, or e-cigarettes, has skyrocketed among teenagers, with many experts attributing this trend to the marketing efforts of ecigarette companies. While e-cigarettes were initially marketed as a safer alternative to traditional cigarettes, research has shown that they can be just as harmful, particularly for young people.

HB 114 has been enacted to respond to the increasing concerns around e-cigarettes, vaping, marijuana and THC-related products among youth. The bill mandates that any student found in possession of, under the influence of, selling, gifting or delivering these substances within a 300-foot radius of any school premises, will be immediately removed and placed in a Disciplinary Alternative Education Program (DAEP).

Please talk to your students about this change in state law and how it could affect their school life.
