Special Projects

The Columbia School Linguistic Society (henceforth the Society) is considering applications for its Special Projects program. Program participation is limited to Society members and to topics or activities related to Columbia School (CS) linguistic analysis or theory.

The purpose of the Special Projects program is to support Society members in activities such as presentation of papers at professional meetings, travel to disseminate CS ideas, publication of CS work, obtaining release time to carry-out CS research, and other scholarly projects deemed worthy of support by the Society's Executive Committee.

Proposals for Special Projects should not exceed five double-spaced pages and should include the following information:

- 1. The purpose of the funding (previous special project applications have funded travel to conferences, paid for research materials, provided financial support so that the recipient was able to step back from other paid work to have time for the project, translation, curriculum development, etc)
 - 2. How much money is being requested, and for what reasons
 - 3. Connections, if any, to previous CS work

Final proposals should be submitted to admin@csling.org.

Support will be provided, pending availability of funds, on an individual basis. Proposals will be reviewed by members of the Society's Executive Committee, assisted by such additional reviewers as they may deem appropriate.
