Magnus Health:

Magnus Health is a secure website for submitting your student's required health information. Parents who are new to TMI will receive a welcome email from Magnus Health that includes login information; returning parents will receive a notification from Magnus Health asking you to update your student's information. Immunizations:

- TMI follows the Texas state requirements for vaccinations. For more information, follow this [link](#).
- **Your student's completed immunization records or exemption papers must be turned in prior to the first date of attendance.**

Medications:

- The TMI Health Center does not administer any medication to our day students **unless it is brought in by the parents in the original bottle**. This includes over-the-counter or prescription medication.
- **All medication must be dropped off and picked up by a parent with this completed [form](#).**
- Please see the TMI Parent-Student Handbook, available from the Student/Parent section for more information regarding medication.

Illnesses and injuries:

- We encourage our students to come to the Health Center on the lower level of Frost Athletic Center for any urgent needs during the day. If it is a non-urgent need, we encourage students to come before school, during breaks, lunch or after school.
- **If your child has had a fever of 100.4° F or greater, please keep them home until fever free for 24 hours without fever reducing medication.**

Dear Parents,

TMI is excited to once again partner with Goodside Health/School Med, bringing healthcare services to our campus. Goodside Health providers can assess, diagnose, and treat the most common pediatric conditions. Every student is eligible to register for SchoolMed, regardless of insurance or residency status. (Note: Students must be registered to take part in the program.)

SchoolMed works just like a clinic visit. When your student feels sick at school, they can go to the Health Center to receive care. Students can be online with a Goodside Health provider within a few minutes! When a prescription is needed, the provider will call it into the local pharmacy. Parents can also join every visit via third-party video calling. SchoolMed also creates school excuse notes for students and parents. Register for SchoolMed and make sure every student has instant access to care when they feel sick at school! Sign-up online anytime [here](#). Select "TMI Episcopal" from the drop down, click the link, and be sure to answer every question. SchoolMed is provided at the lowest possible cost to families. The final cost of a visit depends on your health insurance. You may be responsible for a copay, deductible, or coinsurance.

TMI has also partnered with SchoolMed: Mental Health organized through Goodside Health. This is a service offered at no additional cost to parents as it is funded by TMI. We believe it's important that every student has every opportunity to succeed at school. Parental/guardian consent is required to participate.
