

I) How to change Twitter security and privacy settings

- 1) Go to the upper right hand corner and click on your picture, then choose “settings”.



- 2) Choose “Security and Privacy” first



- 3) Login verification gets a bit complicated. Login verification allows you to verify Twitter Logins from your phone or the Twitter app. It's a two step system. If you are not familiar with this, contact Sean directly if you wish to set this up.

Password reset

When you check this box, you will be required to verify additional information before you can request a password reset with just your @username. If you have a phone number on your account, you will be asked to verify that phone number before you can request a password reset with just your email address.

- 4) There are two options here that you might want to consider.
- Do not allow anyone to tag my in photos is a setting that prevents anyone from adding you to a picture you may not want associated with your account. You can also only limit this to people you follow.
 - If you want to use your account for your classroom and parents only, you can set "Protect My Tweets". This means anything you tweet is not available publicly. Only those that you approve will see your tweets. This will be only people you approve to follow you.

- 5) The next set of settings allows you to decide if you want others to find you by email address or not. If you uncheck it, they can't discover you by that method.


