I. Calendar Committee Update

House Bill 130 has been signed into legislation by the governor. The bill outlines the required number of hours students must attend school. It has been increased to 1140 hours in a year. Currently, elementary students' instructional hours are 990 and secondary students' are 1040. Up to 60 instructional hours per school year for elementary grades and 30 hours for middle and high school grades may be used for professional work hours, which may be embedded during the course of a normal school day (PLCs, for example).

Now that we know the requirement, we are able to move forward with our calendar committee to develop options for staff and parents to vote on. The calendar with the most votes will be presented to the school board for approval.

II. Social Studies/History Adoption

The middle school and high school history and social studies teachers began the selection process for the adoption of new materials. There are limited publishers who met the state's criteria for being allowable for core instruction adoption. Our last presentation will be on April 3rd and then the teachers will decide on the publisher that most closely meets the needs of our students. We will also set up a few dates for community members to come review the materials and give feedback. After the committee decides on the publisher they want to adopt, we will submit the information to the school board for approval.
