Abstracts are written in two languages (Bahasa Indonesia and English). Abstract is written using Times New Roman with 10-pt font size, italicized, and single space. Abstract in English is displayed before Indonesian Abstract. The abstract should include the content of the journal, including the purpose of the research, the research method, and the results and conclusions of the journal. Abstract should not contain any other references or display equations. Your abstract should not exceed 250 words. Leave one blank line of single space, 10 pts font size before the keywords.

Keywords: 3-5 keywords; Times New Roman; 10 pts font size.

1. INTRODUCTION (Times New Roman 12 pts, bold, all capital letters)

In this section, describe the background of research briefly, the importance of the research, objectives and benefits of the research. Avoid having additional sub-section in the introduction section. Introduction is written in Times New Roman, 11 pts, single spaced and justified. The first of line of each paragraph should be indented 0.5 cm from the left margin. Leave one blank single-spaced line, 11 pts font before the next section.

The size of the paper is standard A4-paper. Set up the top and bottom margins as 2.5 cm, and the left and right margins as 3 cm.

2. MATERIALS AND METHODS (Times New Roman 12 pts, bold, all capital letters)

2.1. Materials (Times New Roman 11 pts, italicized)

List the materials being used in the research. If any, specify the origin of your samples. Write this material subsection in Times New Roman, 11 pts, single spaced and justified. The first of line of

each paragraph should be indented 0.5 cm from the left margin. Give a 6-pt space between the last line of current sub-section before a new sub-section.

2.2. *Methods (Times New Roman 11 pts, italicized)*

Provide sufficient details to allow the work to be reproduced by an independent researcher. Methods that are already published should be summarized, and indicated by a reference. If quoting directly from a previously published method, use quotation marks and also cite the source. Any modifications to existing methods should also be described. Write this methods subsection in Times New Roman, 11 pts, single spaced and justified. There should be no space between the title of your subsection and the first line of it. The first of line of each paragraph should be indented 0.5 cm from the left margin. Give a 6-pt space between the last line of current sub-section before a new sub-section. If needed, you can divide your methods into a few sub-sections.

2.3. *Additional subsection on methods (Times New Roman 11 pts, italicized, capital letter on the first letter only)*

All of additional subsection should be written in Times New Roman, 11 pts, single spaced and justified. There should be no space between the title of your subsection and the first line of said subsection. The first of line of each paragraph should be indented 0.5 cm from the left margin. Give a 6-pt space between each sub-section. The last subsection should have a 6-pt space from a new section.

3. RESULTS AND DISCUSSION (Times New Roman 12 pts, bold, all capital letters)

Results should be presented in a clear and concise manner. The discussion should explore the significance of the research results, avoiding overly broad quotes from the literature. Discussion is the most important part of your article. Make the discussion in accordance with the results, without repeating the results. The following components that should be covered in the discussion are: How does the research result relate to the original question or objectives outlined in the Introduction section? Does the study provide a scientific interpretation for each of the results? Are your results consistent with what other researchers have reported? This section should be written in Times New Roman, 11 pts, single spaced and justified.

The first of line of each paragraph should be indented 0.5 cm from the left margin. There should be no space in between paragraphs within the same sub-section. If needed, you can have your discussion divided into several sub-sections. Avoid the use of sub-subsection. Give a 6-pt space between each sub-section.

3.1. *Additional subsection (Times New Roman 11 pts, italicized, capital letter on the first letter only)*

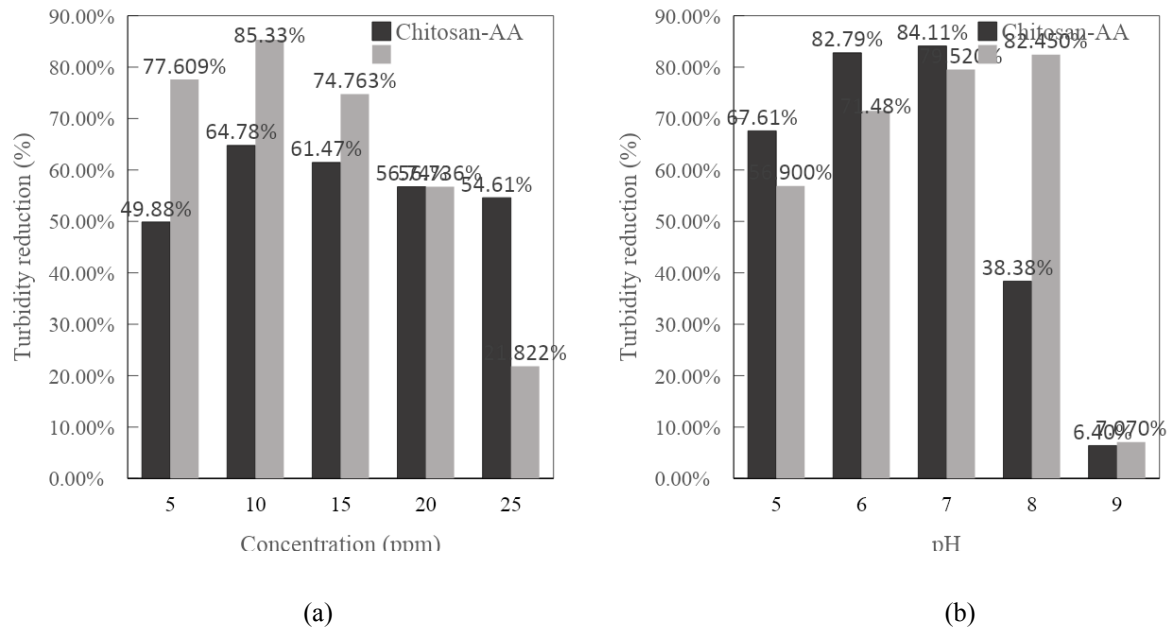


Figure 1. Write the title of your figure as the caption, (a) written in Times New Roman, (b) 10 pts, at the center of the paper

If you use any figure(s) in your manuscript, make sure that the figure is in a good quality to be reproduced in a black-and-white print. While the online version of your article would be in color, the print-out version the journal would be in black-and-white. The size of your figure should be within the reasonable size in accordance to the desired dimensions of the published version. All of your figures should be numbered to their sequence of appearance in the text (written in the caption as **Figure 1.**; **Figure 2.**; and so on) and must be referred in the text. In the text, refer the figure as **Fig. X**. Provide captions to the figures separately from the figures below them (not inside the

figures). For editing purposes, you can also submit the figures as separate files from the manuscript when you are submitting your manuscript. Below is an example of figures in a text.

3.2. Another additional subsection

You can present your data in tables. Submit tables as editable text, and not as an image. All of your tables should be numbered to their sequence of appearance in the text (written in the caption as **Table 1.**; **Table 2.**; and so on) and must be referred in the text. Provide captions to each table above the corresponding table. Place any table notes below the table body. The table should be put at the center of the paper. The caption of the table should be written in Times New Roman, 10 pts, and centered. The size of letters and numbers in the table should not be less than 9 pts to ensure that the table is still legible. Below is an example of a table in the text.

3.3. *More additional subsection*

All of references cited in the text is also present in the reference list et vice versa. Using a citation manager software, such as Mendeley or EndNote is highly encouraged. The in-text citation list of references should be formatted in Author-Date (APA 7th Ed.) style. references should be arranged first alphabetically and then further sorted chronologically if necessary. More than one reference from the same author(s) in the same year must be identified by the letters 'a', 'b', 'c', etc., placed after the year of publication.

4. CONCLUSIONS (Times New Roman 12 pts, bold, all capital letters)

The main conclusions of the study may be presented in the conclusions section. Conclusion should be presented in a concise manner. This section should be written in Times New Roman, 11 pts, single spaced and justified.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT (Times New Roman 12 pts, bold, all capital letters)

In this section, list the individuals and or parties who provided help and support during the research. This section should be written in Times New Roman, 11 pts, single spaced and justified. If needed, in compliance to funder's requirements, acknowledgement to the organization/institution granting the fund can be presented in this section in the following format. Funding: This work was supported by the Name of the Organization/Institution [grant numbers xxxx, yyyy].
