	Contest Toastmaster	Speech contests are an important part of the Toastmasters International educational program. Speech contests provide: 1. An opportunity for speakers to gain contest experience and to recognize the best speakers as an encouragement to everyone 2. Contests also provide an opportunity to learn by observing the more proficient speakers who have	

benefitted from their Toastmasters training.

Before we begin our contest today, let's review a few housekeeping items:

In Person Contests:

Please give your full attention to the contestants during their presentation and limit distractions.

There will be one minute of silence between each speaker to allow the judges to mark their ballots.

When the last speaker has finished, we will observe silence to allow our judges time to concentrate, tally their ballots, and select the contest winners.

Judges, when you are done, please raise your ballot in the air, and our ballot counters can collect them. When the ballots are collected, our period of silence will end. Ballots will be counted and winners will be announced at the end of the contest.

Laughing, clapping, or other normal audience responses to the speaker is permitted.

Entering and leaving the room should be restricted to the minute of silence between contestants or after all contestants have finished. <Name> and <Name> are our Sergeants at Arms and will be stationed at the doors.

Please turn cell phones, and watches to silent, so they will not distract the speakers. There will be plenty of photo opportunities after the contests are over. Audio or video recording is not permitted without the prior written permission of the contestants.

Contestants will be introduced by saying their name, the title of their speech, the title of their speech and their name. Each contestant will then reply "Ready" indicating their audio and video equipment is working. This reply does not count in the timing of the speech. The timing will begin when the contestant gives their first word or overt gesture.
