The survey questions are personal but are not considered sensitive questions. Therefore, while you may feel uncomfortable answering the questions, the risk of this is thought to be unlikely.

We will use your email address to link your questionnaire responses from the in-person study session to the responses you provide four months later. To protect your privacy (identity), we'll assign a study ID code to your questionnaire responses. Once we do this, we'll delete the email address from the questionnaire responses so the responses will only have the study ID code. Finally, once you are given your incentive, we'll delete your email address from study records. While the study is active, all data will be stored in a password-protected University drive.

All members of the research team will have access to the de-identified data. However, only the PI and Co-I will have access to the linking list that includes your identifying information. Other people may need to see the information we collect about you, to make sure that we are conducting this study in a safe and appropriate manner, including people who work for UNC Charlotte (e.g., auditors, Office of Research Protections and Integrity staff), the study sponsor [if applicable], and other agencies with appropriate permission.

Your data, with direct identifiers removed, will be stored, used, and shared with others for future research studies without additional consent from you. This may include sharing your individual de-identified data with other researchers, journals, data repositories, and/or funding sources.

You will receive a \$25 Amazon e-gift card after you finish the third and final survey. We cannot give you a gift card in a smaller increment. If you do not complete all three surveys, you will not receive the gift card. [Or if the gift card will be prorated, explain.] Payments to subjects are considered taxable income. Therefore, we are required to give the University's Financial Services division a log with the names of all individuals who received a payment. This log is for tax purposes only and will be kept separate from study data.
