
TSGT Gordon K. "Corky" Montgomery



Gordon K. "Corky" Montgomery, age 97, of Oshkosh, returned to the Lord on Wednesday, May 1, 2013, at Mercy Medical Center. Corky was born on April 26, 1916, in North Fond du Lac, the son of David and Harriet (Kolb) Montgomery. A graduate of Oshkosh High School in 1935, Corky attended Oshkosh Business College where he completed the Accounting course, graduating in 1937. It was there that he met the love of his life, Bernice "Bunny" Lindsay. They were married on August 30, 1941, and Bunny preceded Corky in death on December 6, 2012.

Employed for 42 years Brickham Stamping Company, the last 37 years as plant manager, Corky retired in 1979.
