 <p>Identify 3-5 golden lines from the text that are particularly interesting or powerful and explain why you think these lines are important and how they impacted your thinking about this topic.</p>	 <p>Select a thinking routine from the Project Zero collection (e.g., Connect, Extend, Challenge or I Used to Think...Now I Think) to complete based on the reading.</p>	 <p>Write or type a response to one of the prompts about the text.</p>
