

Retake Policy

Homework / Quizzes: No retake / point recovery will be offered for homework and/or quizzes.

Chapter Tests: Students will be allowed to make test corrections to recover at most half of the points lost on the given test. For example, if a student scored 70/100 on the test, they can gain at most 15 points back from doing test corrections. This would result in a final test grade of 85/100. ***** Important ***** Students must fully complete their test review for the corresponding test to be eligible for test corrections. 1

Homework/ACT

Homework will be assigned for every section and expected to be completed by students individually or group work, not websites doing it for the students. On most Wednesdays students will be going ACT Mathematics and Science test reviews and testing because of late starts. Science ACT is also reviewed in this class because of analyzing the graphs and the mathematical analysis that is part of the Science portion of the ACT related directly to Mathematics. The effort students put into this will be given as 20% of the students grade.

Technology Policy

Midterm / Final: No retake / point recovery will be offered.
