**AGE LEVEL:** 11-13 YEARS OLD

**GRADE LEVEL:** Grade VI

**SUBJECT:** English VI and Organic Agriculture

**TOPIC:** Making Inferences

- Inferring Moods of Certain Events

**PREREQUISITE:** Students should have clear understanding of the mood of certain events through actions/utterances

**DURATION:** 1 to 2 sessions (1 session )

**LEARNING OBJECTIVES**

By the end of this lesson, students should be able to:

1. Make inference
2. Infer the mood of certain events through speakers' actions
3. Enumerate ways of controlling/ Preventing harmful effect of human activities to the environment.

**MAIN CONCEPTS & SKILLS**

- Inferencing is the process of reaching conclusions based on information within the text. Can be used in reading both fiction and nonfiction.
- An inference is when we take clues from a story plus what we already know from our own experiences to decide what the author means.
- The author will not always tell us everything, so we need to use inferences to understand and visualize the story.
- Ways of controlling /preventing harmful effect of human activities to the environment:  
Disease control program  
proper disposal  
proper waste disposal

pollution control  
planting trees  
proper sanitation  
recycling

### **PRESENTATION OF THE LESSON**

#### **A. Preparatory Activities**

1. Review:( see appendix 1)

Using the expressions “ Hope-can” and “Wish- Could”

( Use “hope-can” to express something that is likely to happen with present form of the verb & Use “ wish-could” to express something that is not likely to happen with the present form of the verb)

- Study the following sentences. Give one clap for sentences that are likely to happen and two claps for sentences that are unlikely to happen.
- ( eliminate from the group the pupils who make mistakes in clapping.)

1. The rich man hopes he can help the typhoon victims.
2. Somewhere down the road, somebody wishes she could be a flower.
3. The family wishes they could tour around the world for free.
4. People hope they can free Pasig River from garbage.

2. Motivation:

( showing Pictures of natures )(see Appendix 2)

-Are you a nature lover? Why?

- Observe the things around you and list down as many as possible.( on the board )

- Have you ever wondered why those things exist?

- Or wonder how long will they be there?
- 3. Unlocking of Difficulties( see appendix 3 )
  1. Nature –the physical world and everything in it ( such as plants, animals,mountains, oceans, stars, etc.) that is not made by people.
  2. Pollution – The action or process of making land, water, air, etc. dirty and not safe or suitable to use.
  3. Harmful – causing or capable of causing damage or harm.
  4. Destabilizing – to make something unstable

### **B. Development of lesson:**

Read the Poem: ( see Appendix 4)

#### **What The Nature Suffers?**

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Open Drainage systems ,

### **C. Analysis and Discussion:**

1. How did you feel while listening to the poem?
2. What feelings/moods were expressed in the poem?

3. What was the author saying in the poem?
4. Do you have the same feeling as the author?
5. Are you wondering about the natural things around you?
6. Think of the people today, do you think they still have time to wonder about beautiful things around them? Why do you say so?
7. What ensures us of a safe and healthy environment now & even for the future generation?
8. Enumerate the ways of controlling / preventing harmful effects of human activities to the environment?
9. Having a sustained ecological balance, do you think we can be ensured of a safe and healthy environment now and for the future generation? Why?

#### **D. Engagement Activities**

(Reading of the story by the teacher)

##### **Jesus Walks on water (see Appendix 5)**

Immediately after this, Jesus made his disciples get back into the boat and across to the other side of the lake while he sent the people home. Afterward he went up into the hills by himself to pray. **E. Generalization:**

How can we tell or infer the mood conveyed by a particular events? (Through the speaker's actions, intentions/utterances or words)

**F. Post Activity**

**1. Application ( see appendix 6)**

Infer the mood conveyed by the following events:

1. It was about 2 o'clock in the afternoon. People were busy enjoying their free time at the mall. Suddenly, the fire alarm sounded and fire trucks started heading towards the place.
2. What a day it was! Flags were flying, bands were playing and all the lovely ladies had flowers in their hair. Everybody was in their fancy costumes.

**2. Enrichment: Group Activity (see appendix 7 )**

- a. Teacher prepares rolled strips containing the different moods and place them in a box.
- b. Ask the pupils to group by row and choose a leader
- c. Each leader will get a strip of rolled paper containing the mood they are to convey. ( can be done thru actions/ dialogues depending on the members' choice.)
- d. Acting out

***Assessment / Evaluation ( Evaluation must be 2 items only)***

In two sentences describe the trait of a person in each of the ff. selections.
