Getting there - Parking

The venue is wheelchair accessible from the car park. Parking is free and available to all attendees.

Getting there - Public Transport

Tram

Tram 96 has a level access stop. The venue is approximately 650 metres from the Nicholson St/Albert St stop and the journey is mostly flat according to Google Maps.

Trams 1 and 6 are approximately 300 metres from the Victoria St/Lygon St stop and the journey is mostly flat according to Google Maps. **The Victoria St/Lygon St stop is not a level access stop.**

Getting inside

Accessible entrance is via the front door - the door is a double door with a pull handle.

Once inside, there is a second set of doors with a pull handle. Then you enter the venue, which is flat. Seating is available inside the venue for audience members and artists performing on stage.

There is a clear pathway to the stage area with no obstructions. Seating will also be available near the stage.

There is a small rise onto the stage and a mobile ramp available for use for anyone requiring ramp assistance getting onto the stage.

Toilets

There are no changing places, facilities and no hoist available but there are accessible toilets on the right as you enter the venue.

The accessible toilet door is a push door with a handle.

There are also three cubicles, first door on your left as you enter the area.

There is no smoke machine or strobes at the venue. However, there are loud noises which may be regarded as high intensity.

A quiet space will be available and event organisers (Off The List and Out Hear) will direct any attendees to those spaces where required on the day.

Off The List also has a sensory kit with a blanket, ear plugs and sensory aids which we can loan to you if needed.
