

Grading and Homework Policy: Grades will be calculated based on the following weights:

- 55% Tests/Quizzes
- 15% Graded Assignments and Classwork
- 15% Homework
- 15% Class Participation

Basic concepts of probability and statistical inference. Included are the binominal, normal, and chi-square distributions. Practical applications are examined. Computer assignments using Minitab form an integral part of the course.

Notes & class materials will be posted to our Google Classroom. Students will be provided a printed copy of the unit notes at the beginning of the Chapter. Students will complete instruction (mini lesson) or investigation, followed by independent practice. Some lessons may be in the form of a flipped classroom where students watch a video and take notes at home, then complete independent practice in class. Collaboration with other students will be done electronically or in class by sharing statistics.

Homework

Reduction in grade for any late homework submitted; no more than 4 late homeworks accepted per quarter.

*Make-up assignments may be assigned at the teachers discretion

Late homework must be submitted prior to the progress report and/or the end of the marking period.

All Other Graded Work

(e.g. essays, projects, lab reports, etc.)

Reduction in grade per day late; Maximum Reduction 50%

Late work cannot be handed in after the end of the marking period.

<u>Assessment Information:</u> Formal assessments will be given at the culmination of each unit. In addition, more frequent quizzes will be given assessing smaller, individual topics. There will be projects on occasion.

- Midterm Exam: Will be taken at the end of Quarter 2
- Final Exam will be given later in the year
