Introduction

The Tufts Undergraduate Law Review (TULR) is a newly established academic journal that intends to host an academic and intellectual space for legal and political discourse. Our broader goal is to increase the Tufts community's engagement with local, national, and international legal developments to broaden connections to public civic life outside of our campuses.

Submission Guidelines

Checklist for Submission:

1. Title Page, with a word count
2. Abstract Page, where you are expected to provide an abstract of 150-250 words or less
3. Manuscript, properly formatted
4. References, both in Chicago format and as endnotes

Word Count: All submissions should make an original legal argument and use as much text as is reasonably necessary to defend this argument. All articles should be approximately 2500- 4000 words long. Submissions substantially longer than 4000 words may not be prioritized in the editorial process or not considered at all.

Formatting:

- All submissions should take the form of a .doc or .docx Microsoft Word file (no .pdf, .rtf, or .pages documents will be accepted). Articles should begin with a Chicago title page, contain 1-inch margins, have clear page numberings (in accordance with Chicago style), maintain double-spaced line spacing, and be typed in 12-point Times New Roman font.

Abstracts:

- Following the title page, please add in a short abstract of approximately 150-250 words on a separate page. This abstract should offer a quick glimpse into your overall legal argument and its relevance, as well as the specific points you hope to expand upon in your article.

References:

- References must be included in proper Chicago style format throughout the article. In addition, after the conclusion of the formal text of the article, please include a bibliography containing endnotes (also in Chicago style).
