#### How Did You Get Into Writing?

- I've been writing songs, poems and stories since I was about 4 years old. I wrote my first book at age 8, and my mother, a teacher, insisted I learn how to properly punctuate dialog and all of that. So I got a very early start! I'd written 16 books by the time I graduated from high school, but I set all those aside for years until 2012, when my friend talked me into getting back into it again.

I write the blurb first usually, then some character details. Then I dig in. If I do make an outline, it's
usually for the second half of the book once I figure out what's going to happen. I mean, after the
characters tell me what's going to happen LOL.

#### What are some of your hobbies?

 I live near the beach so going there when I have time, traveling, museums, Broadway shows, playing the piano, swimming, hiking.

#### Have you attended any signings? If so, what was your favorite thing about it?

- I've attended several signings. I love meeting readers who are very familiar with my work and have been waiting a long time to meet me. That's the best, and I've had that experience a few times now.

- I love hearing that my books have made a reader think or feel.

- I generally work on editing first (for clients) and take care of my social media stuff, then write for a while. Then I take a break to edit and social media, then write again. I kind of go back and forth. I work 10-14 hour days most of the time, and rarely take a day off.

- The more you write, the better you get at it.

## Where do you find the names for your characters?

- They mostly just come to me. I have some characters with simple, common names, and others with very unusual names like Journey and Valley.

## Anything else you want your readers to know about you?

- Getting a 5 star review or a note from readers about my work is literally the best thing ever.
