WikiPathways portal maintenance

This document describes how to edit and maintain an existing portal at WikiPathways. The example portal used in this document is the Disease portal: http://www.wikipathways.org/index.php/Portal:Disease

Overview

- Each portal page consist of a set of boxes: one **title box** and one or more **content boxes**.
- The placement, size, number of boxes, titles and links to wiki pages with content is defined on the main page.
- The **title box** is located at the top of the portal page and typically spans the width of the page
- The **content boxes** are placed under the title box, side-by-side and/or stacked.
- The **design** (color, font etc) of the two type of boxes is defined in **templates**: box-title and nox-normal.
- The **content** of all boxes are defined in separate portal sub-pages pages.
- Adding the portal to the Portal Category


The main page

Clicking **Edit** at the top of the portal page will open the page in edit mode:



The **title box** and **content boxes** are defined in blocks of lines. We will review the title box and one content box below.

The **title box** of the page is defined by the first set of lines. Comments are in green:




The definition of the content boxes is enclosed in a "div" section, with style information about the alignment and size of the div, and consequently the boxes. In this case, the style is set for 4 content boxes, that is "Get Information", "Get involved", "Featured Pathway" and "Special Issue: Rare diseases".

Get information

The first **content boxes** is defined in the same way as the title box:





The last two boxes is defined in a separate div with a different width and alignment. Note that the width defined for the two divs must equal 99%, in this case 62% and 37%:

The template pages

The box templates are always defined on portal sub-pages named *box-title* and *box-normal*. The example below is for the GenMAPP portal. Simply swap out "Disease" in the url for the name of your portal (e.g. http://www.wikipathways.org/index.php/Portal:SGD/box-title).

These templates include MediaWiki formatting help for box templates, so this is what you see when you first open the page. Click **Edit** at the top to edit the design of the boxes, such as header and background color, font size etc. The page includes comments for the various elements:

The content pages

Content pages are always portal sub-pages. From the first section of this document, we know that the content for the various boxes can be found on the following portal sub-pages pages:

To edit the content of the boxes, simply click **Edit** at the top of each of the above pages. The content boxes can include any figures, tables, regular text and links. For syntax help, refer to the MediaWiki syntax help: http://www.mediawiki.org/wiki/Help:Formatting

Featured Pathways box

The contents of the **Featured Pathways** is different from other content boxes, and may vary between portals. Most portals use the **pathwayOfTheDay** template mechanism.

There is a difference between the **Featured** and **FeaturedPathways** sub-pages of a portal:

Featured controls what appears in the **Featured Pathways** box on the main page. See below for the two main options.

FeaturedPathways keeps a list of all pathways related to the portal, and can be used to generate content for the **Featured Pathways** box using the **pathwayOfTheDay** template.

For the **Featured** sub-page, there are basically two options. To edit this page, enter "/Featured" at the end of the URL for your main page, and then click Edit at the top of the page.

Example 1: pathwayOfTheDay template

The Disease portal uses the pathwayOfTheDay template. This template chooses one pathway per day from the subset of pathways with the curation tag.

Example 2: List of thumbnails combined with Browse

Many portals display a defined set of pathways (one or two) as thumbnails, with a link to all relevant pathways. If you have a designated curation tag for your pathways, you can use the built-in Browse mechanism to view all pathways. The example below is for the SGD portal.

FeaturedPathways sub-page

This page is a simple wiki-formatted list of pathways for the portal, in this format:

* [[Pathway:WP2447]]
* [[Pathway:WP2371]]
* [[Pathway:WP2059]]
* [[Pathway:WP3853]]
```

This list can be read by the **pathwayOfTheDay** template mentioned (above, see example 1), and is usually also linked to directly from the **Featured** box.

Adding the portal to the Portal Category

WikiPathways has a <u>WikiPathways Portals</u> page listing all portals (just add a new list item with a link to your portal page) and a category. Make sure the Portal is listed on both places. Adding

the portal to the category requires adding the following like just after the $<\!\!$ div $>\!\!$ of the above templates:

After you have saved the wiki page, you can verify on <u>Category:Portals</u> that it shows up as expected.
